The Rev. T. Owen Hughes officiated at the house and church and paid a fitting tribute to a loyal and upright life.

MR. ANGUS DOHERTY

Deep sadness fell over the community of Lorne Valley and vicinity when death entered their midst and suddenly called to its eternal home the spirit of Mr. Angus Doherty on Monday morning, April 6th.

The deceased who was born at Belfast seventy-nine years ago, had been a very strong and healthy man until about a year ago. He was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. John Doherty and was one of a family of nine. All of his brothers and sisters predeceased him some years ago.

When he was but an infant, 8 months old, his parents took him to Riverton where they made their new home. It might also be mentioned that Mr. and Mrs. John Doherty were the first settlers in Riverton. When he was a young man of 28 he married Miss Katherine MacSwain of that place.

They had a family of five children, two boys and three girls. He was an ideal christian husband and father in every sense. His wife predeceased him seventeen years ago. He was one of those wonderful men who always seemed equal to every emergency, always willing to serve others in time of need, and had the honor and confidence of all those with whom he came in contact.

His dearly beloved son, James, was called to his eternal home just eleven months ago. It is quite evident that the overbearing shock of his son's death lessened Mr. Doherty's days.

This highly esteemed citizen had heart failure and although uneasy, his friends entertained the brightest hopes for his recovery. In October, 1935, after his son's death, Mr. Doherty with his daughter moved to Lorne Valley.
