## N. Y. Stocks

NEW YORK (AP) - The stock market stepped ahead last week and registered its sixth straight weekly advance.

There were times when the market faltered, however, and some thought they could detect signs of hesitancy developing in the general upward trend.

The record, nonetheless, was clear - in the last 15 sessions of the current six-week advance the market has hit 11 record high marks as measured by the Associated Press average of 60 stocks.

The average closed Friday at \$172.50, only 30 cents under its record high registered the previous day.

The five most active issues on the New York stock exchange were Baldwin-Lima-Hamilton up 2 1/4% at 228.00 shares; Sperry Rand "when issued" up 1/4% at 28; Allegheny Corp. up 1/2% at 10 1/2.

## U.S. Steel

CLEVELAND (AP) - Sales, profits, operating costs, prices and the number of employees all will increase in the steel industry during the last half of this year, Steel magazine said Sunday in its mid-year survey of 7,600 companies.

The magazine's survey pointed to a two-per-cent rise in sales volume which would make 1955's sales soar to \$120,000,000,000, up 9.1 per cent from last year and only four per cent under the 1953 record.

Prospects for 1956 are even brighter, many executives said in replying to the weekly metalworking journal's questionnaire, and these prospects have inspired plans for expansion next year by 30 per cent of the companies surveyed.

Two-thirds of the survey answers saw manufacturing costs going up in the last half of 1955 and continuing their climb into next year. Price increases of between 2.5 and 7.5 per cent were predicted for later this summer by 37 per cent of the steel companies queried.

Net profits will be 5.1 per cent above last year's second half earnings; employed manpower in the industry will be up 1.3 per cent; and new products will be introduced by 48 per cent of the companies, other answers predicted.

Last week the industry produced at 97 per cent of capacity, equaling the year's high established in May, Steel said.

The new company, Telecables and Wire Ltd., will be owned jointly by General Cable, Canada Wire and Cable, and the British firm of Telegraph Construction and Maintenance Co.

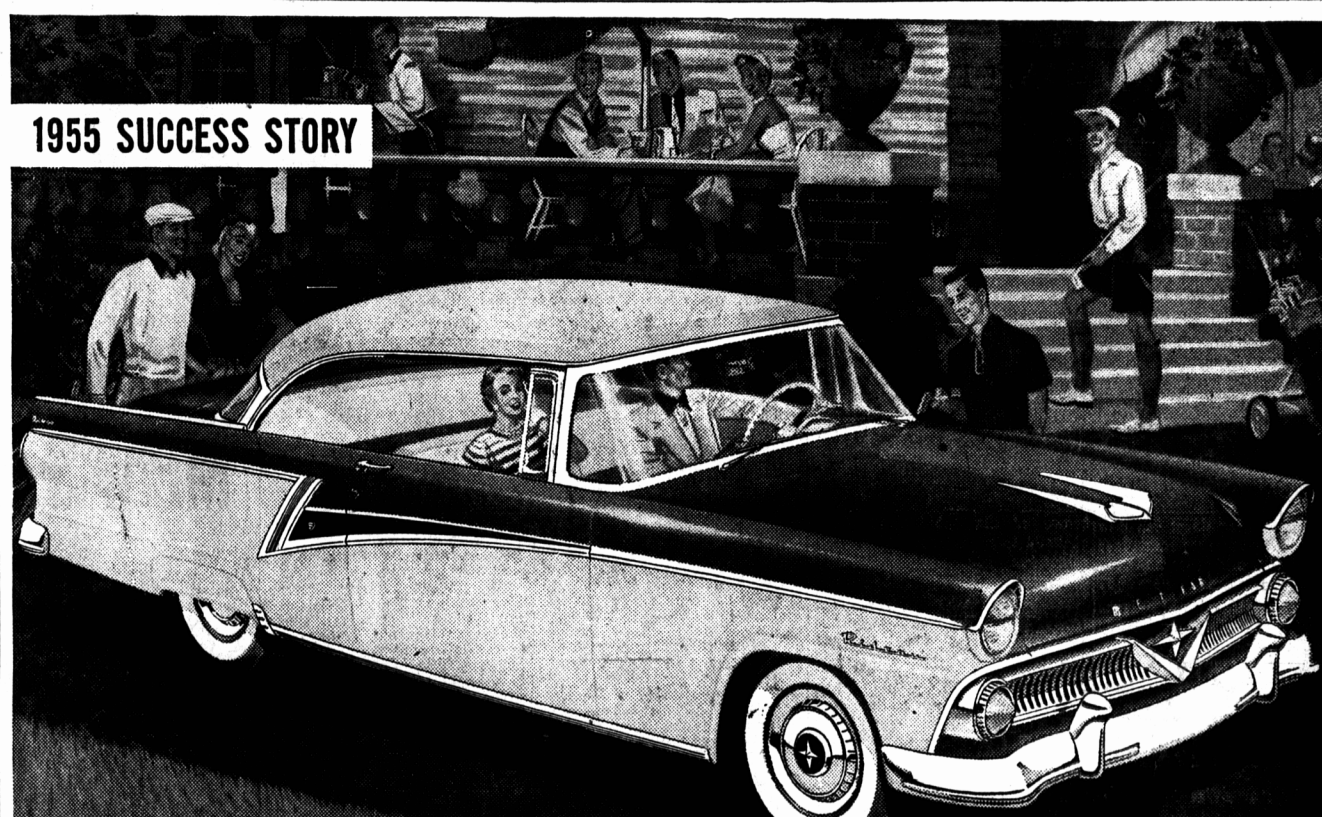

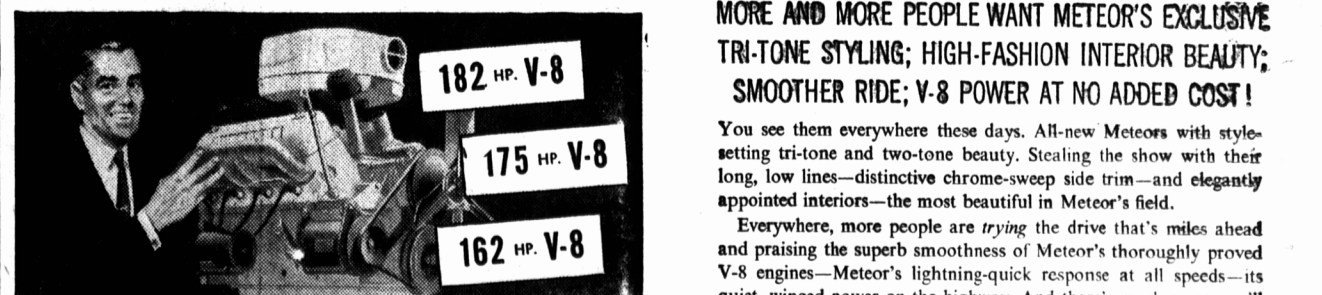
