CONTRACT BRIDGE

South dealer. Neither side vulnerable.
NORTH: ♠ Q 2, ♥ J 6, ♦ J 8 7 5 4 3 2, ♣ A K 10 9 7 5 4 3 2
WEST: ♠ 10, ♥ A K 10 9 7 5 4 3 2, ♦ A K 10 9 7 5 4 3 2, ♣ Q 10
EAST: ♠ K J 9 8 7 6 5 4 3 2, ♥ 9 8 5 3 2, ♦ A K 10 9 7 5 4 3 2, ♣ A K 6
SOUTH: ♠ A 10 4 3, ♥ A K Q 8 7, ♦ 8, ♣ A K 6

bid six clubs, unable to resist the mention of his seven-card suit. Kempson became declarer in the slam contract, having only three trumps. West led the king of diamonds and continued with the ace, on which East signalled with the nine of spades. Declarer ruffed the diamond, played the A-K of clubs, and had no difficulty making the rest of the tricks. At the other table where the slam was bid, South opened one club (also an artificial bid showing a big hand). West overcalled with five diamonds and North bid six clubs. Thus the slam was reached before EAST... had a chance to bid. But at this table the declarer ran into hard luck. He was defeated without much ceremony. Again West opened the king of diamonds and continued with the ace. The East player saw no advantage to signalling his spade strength. He thought it more important to resort to every last means to try to beat the slam. So instead of discarding on the ace of diamonds he trumped it. East did not mind trumping his partner's trick even if it turned out declarer had another diamond. The slam, in such case, would be beaten whether he trumped or not. But East took out insurance by ruffing with the nine just in case South had no more diamonds either. It was a fortunate decision. Declarer was forced to overruff and the uppercut succeeded. West had to make a trump trick and declarer had to go down.

Opening lead—king of diamonds. This hand was played in a pair tournament at Juan les Pins a couple of summers ago. At two tables a final contract of six clubs was reached. South, in the bidding sequence shown, was Ewart Kempson, of England, editor of the (British) Bridge Magazine. He also played in the team of four event on the American team in the same tournament. ("Lend-lease," was the way he put it.)

Farmers' Clothes Worn By Laotians

By BRUCE RUSSELL. VIENTIANE, Laos (Reuters)—Laotian government troops are wearing farmers' clothes to prevent easy identification in their guerrilla war with Communist rebels, Brig-Gen. Ouan Rittkone said Thursday. The army commander said fighting still is going on around Sam Teu Fort, in northeastern Sam Neua province, which has changed hands four times since Saturday. Ouan said rebels first took the fort in a mortar attack last Saturday; were driven out Sunday, recaptured the fort Tuesday and were driven out again Thursday. As he announced continuing fighting, the United Nations fact-finding mission was given a 10-minute military briefing from maps—but no documentary evidence as yet—of Laotian claims that Communist North Viet Nam is aiding the Pathet Lao rebels. Because it was a religious holiday, the four-power mission Thursday morning made a sight-seeing tour of Vientiane. FEW REPORTS READY Members of the mission are reported to have said the Laotian government had little prepared for them to use in their work of sifting the evidence on the rebellion. The mission was scheduled to have two social engagements with government officials today. Communist rebel activity was reported Thursday in two more provinces bordering Thailand and South Viet Nam. Military sources reported skirmishes and some rebel casualties in Saravane and Sayabouly provinces earlier this week. The sources said that there were only isolated incidents and the rebels posed no military threat. Dealing with the situation in the south, Ouan said 2,000 Vietnamese refugees from Thailand had crossed the border into Laos.
