Park Royal Church Reports Growth During First Year

Phenomenal growth both spiritually and financially was reported at the annual meeting of Park Royal United Church held Tuesday evening. Rev. Burton Crowe, pastor of the church opened the meeting with scripture reading. Rev. A. Frank MacLeann led the congregation in prayer.

Rev. Mr. Crowe said the reports from all church departments and organizations were most encouraging and he predicted that at this rate of advance, the church which was opened on June 22, 1958 would soon make a name for itself of which every member might well be proud.

The session report given by W.P. MacLeod in the absence of the clerk, Russell Ewing, showed that 132 new members were taken into the fellowship. Twenty-nine of these were on profession of faith. The remainder were on transfer of membership.

Mr. MacLeod reviewed the building program of the church and thanked all those who had so generously made voluntary contributions of both time and money. A special word of thanks was extended to Rev. G. Howard Christie who acted as interim moderator during the building of the church and who was present to lay the corner stone.

He reported 26 baptisms during the year and one marriage.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

S.G. Wright, superintendent of the Sunday School reported that there are 276 boys and girls enrolled with an average attendance of 226. Offerings of the Sunday school amounted to \$241 for the six month period.

The financial report presented by Fred Wotton showed that the response of the congregation was outstanding and that steady progress was being made toward reducing the original mortgage.

It was decided at the meeting to build a new manse on the church property early this spring.

Mr. Lester Johnson in reporting for the Women's Auxiliary said their membership had now reached 157. W.A. activities during the year included the holding of several church suppers. With money realized from these sources the ladies were able to make many gifts to the new church. The new president is Mrs. Harold Milligan.

The Young People's Union with a membership of 15 had a successful year of activities according to the report given by the president, Keir Costain. For next year's project, the YPU intends to finish in part the room above the minister's study and the choir room.

Mrs. Burton Crowe reported that the C.G.I.T. group numbers 24 members. During the year the girls, along with carrying out a very interesting program raised \$70.98, assisting Mrs. Crowe in the C.G.I.T. was Mrs. James MacFadyen.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

David Scales in reporting for the education committee noted that all groups under the committee's supervision had made good progress. He urged more church members to volunteer for leaders and teachers of the Sunday School.

He gave special thanks to the superintendent of the Sunday School, Stewart Wright and to his assistants, Charles Walper, Mrs. Keith Taylor and Ivan Darrach who acted as secretary-treasurer. He announced that Tyro and Sigma C groups would be organized shortly.

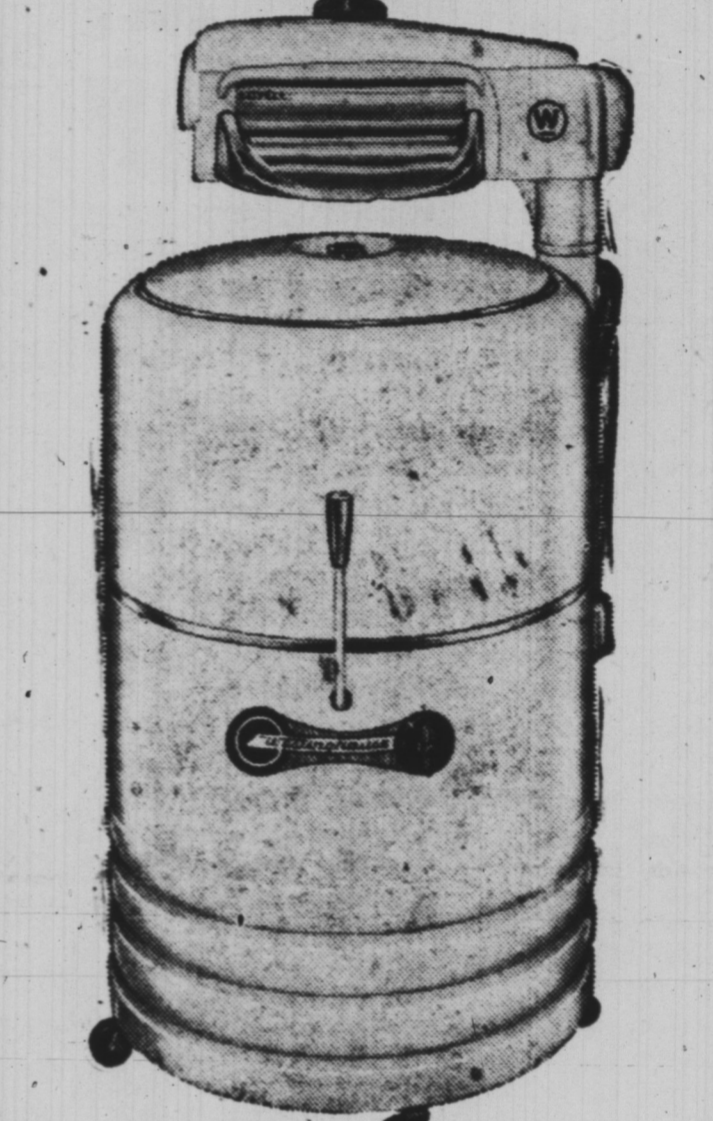
