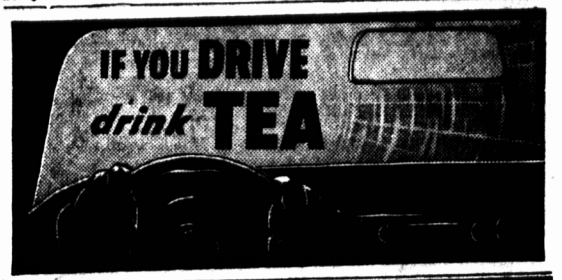


LIEUT. J. H. HODGSON EX OFFICER
