The Jubilee Regiment.

QUEBEC, June 7.—The Jubilee regiment sailed hence for England yesterday. There is trouble in the 8th Rifles on account of having no representation in the Jubilee regiment. Many officers and men have been discharged.

MANCHESTER, June 7.—The Irish National League here has passed a resolution calling upon the Irish to abstain from taking any part in the Diamond Jubilee.

CENTREVILLE, Iowa, June 7.—The aeronaut, John Walters, was killed yesterday while dropping from his balloon with a parachute.

Connolly Acquitted.

HALIFAX, June 7.—Connolly, tried for the murder of old farmer Fuller, at Avonport, has been acquitted.

Weyler's Opinion.

HAVANA, June 7.—Weyler says that the Cuban war will be ended in a short time.

P. E. Island Fish Report.

Georgetown—Cod fishery remains fair, but lobsters and herring scarce.
Malpeque—Catches of lobsters and cod fairly good.
Munipigash—Herring fishery fair, but lobsters scarce.

ATHENS, June 4.—The cabinet decided this evening to sign an armistice on the following conditions: The Greek fleet to quit Ottoman waters. Vessels under the Turkish or neutral flag, bound to or returning from Turkish ports and vessels north of the armistice line will not be examined. Vessels carrying troops and munitions for the Turkish army will not be allowed to enter port north of the line. The Turkish fleet must not leave the Dardanelles. The despatch of reinforcements to garrison towns in the Archipelago is prohibited.

The Pope will be represented at the jubilee ceremonies at London by Mgr. Sambucelli. There will probably be quite as much sincerity in the compliment from the Vatican as in those from any of the temporal powers. In late years many things have transpired to indicate that between the aged Pontiff and the aged Emperor there exist mutual feelings of real regard.
