## Grain Ripening Shows Progress, Spud Crop Escapes Early Blight

It would almost seem that August came with a death-dealing reprieve seen in attempting to redeem the summer. Of the whole season the last week was very pleasant and certainly gave the latter day saints of haymaking a complete opportunity. In addition, the grain made much more rapid progress towards ripening. The potato crop appears to be escaping the blight and winter wheat and winter wheat should be safe for a period.

September is the harvest month, October is for potato digging and so divided in between the fall plowing. The turn crop of decreasing importance both for sale and feed was usually a November operation. Labor of labour and cheaper alternatives have ruled out the potato crop.

### COMPPLICATED FORMULA

The new assistance level is determined on a rather complicated formula related to specific amount of subsidy; i.e. specified ports plus a percentage of the lowest freight rate (by rail or common carrier truck) from certain ports to final destination. Exceptions to this formula are the counties of Halifax, Hants and Kings in Nova Scotia where the new assistance will be \$9.00 per ton, the counties of Albert, Kings, Saint John and Westmorland in New Brunswick where the assistance will be \$12.00 per ton, and the entire Province of Newfoundland where the assistance will be \$20.00 per ton.

Based on rail and truck rates available and using what are felt to be representative current water rates to Halifax, Quebec and Prescott and associated terminal costs to final destination, the balance of costs will increase significantly under the new policy on grain or grain products moved by rail or by rail and water via Quebec and Prescott to all destinations in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick. Newfoundland (East of Bishop's Falls) and to the Southern and Southwestern portions of New Brunswick.

### FREEIGHT ASSISTANCE

We realize that this is a fairly complicated subject but for those who are interested, here is a quote from the recent newsletter of the Maritimes Transportation Commission.

"The policy had as its basic concept the equalization of feed prices for most of New Brunswick by subsidization of a portion of the freight costs. Originally the assistance was based on the rail rates (but was available on movements by water) and covered all rail costs except 50 cents a ton — the cost paid by the shipper.

With changes in rail rates during the past war years this "balance of costs" has increased to \$6.20 per ton when shipped all rail from the Lakehead to the Atlantic Provinces.

The level of the freight assistance prior to Aug. 31 on the Atlantic Provinces is \$13.60 per ton for most of New Brunswick, \$15.20 per ton for the central portions of Prince Edward Island and \$18.00 per ton for the remainder of those Provinces; and from \$18.00 to \$28.20 per ton for Newfoundland. In the case of grain received by water at Maritime (not Newfoundland) ports the assistance is \$11.00 per ton.

The new policy makes provision for common carrier (private cars) are prohibited) and, in fact, bears the level of assistance on truck rates if lower than rail rates. The former policy did require in some parts of Canada

that subsidized grain or grain products must move by rail or water to be eligible for freight assistance but such was not the case in the Maritime Provinces for grain moving by waterborne grain from the Maritime ports.

### HORSE AND BUGGY

The announcement that P.E.I. is to have an air service to Moncton based on the outmoded DC 3 should come as a real

shock to those who are interested in improved transportation and in making a good impression on travellers.

No doubt we will be told that the plane in question is a safe reliable means of transportation but the same may be said of the horse and buggy. Due to lack of pressure equipment the DC 3 flies at altitudes exposed to turbulence and on many occasions provides a very unpleasant journey. This province
