P. E. I. Advisory Bd. To C.N.I.B. Meets

At a meeting of the Prince Edward Island Advisory Board to the Canadian National Institute for the Blind held in the Charlottetown Hotel on Tuesday evening of this week, a number of important items were dealt with including final arrangements for the annual Provincial Campaign for funds which will open on October 18 with an objective of \$7,350.00. Judge C. St. Clair Trainor, chairman of the Board, was elected Provincial Campaign chairman and Mr. S. T. Green again accepted to act as chairman for Special Names in Charlottetown. As in past years the Charlottetown Board members are to take an active part in the Campaign in Charlottetown and Board members in provincial centers and other interested citizens will act as chairmen in their own districts. It was emphasized that the attainment of this year's objective would necessitate the active support of all Board members and friends of the Institute, as well as generous and thoughtful giving on the part of the public. Other matters brought before the meeting included: the possibility of employment for another blind person in Charlottetown; the formation of a club of blind persons in Charlottetown and vicinity; the introduction to the Board of Mr. P. C. Bower who has recently been placed in charge of the Provincial Office of the Institute in Charlottetown and the participation of a young blind woman of Charlottetown in a Home Teachers training course which will commence in Toronto on November 1st.

A highlight of the meeting was a brief talk given by Miss A. M. MacKinnon, Maritime Home Teacher for the C.N.I.B. who spoke of home teaching in general and in particular of her work among a number of blind persons in this province during the past few months. Judge C. St. Clair Trainor, chairman of the Board occupied the chair and other Institute staff members present were, Mr. J. I. Davison, Superintendent of Placements and Mr. R. J. Hill, Assistant Superintendent of the Maritime Division of the C.N.I.B.

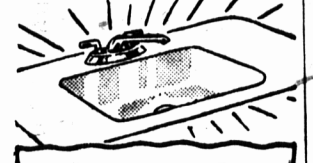
