Yes, why not? I do not believe those who say they would not want to look at it. I think it would be interesting.

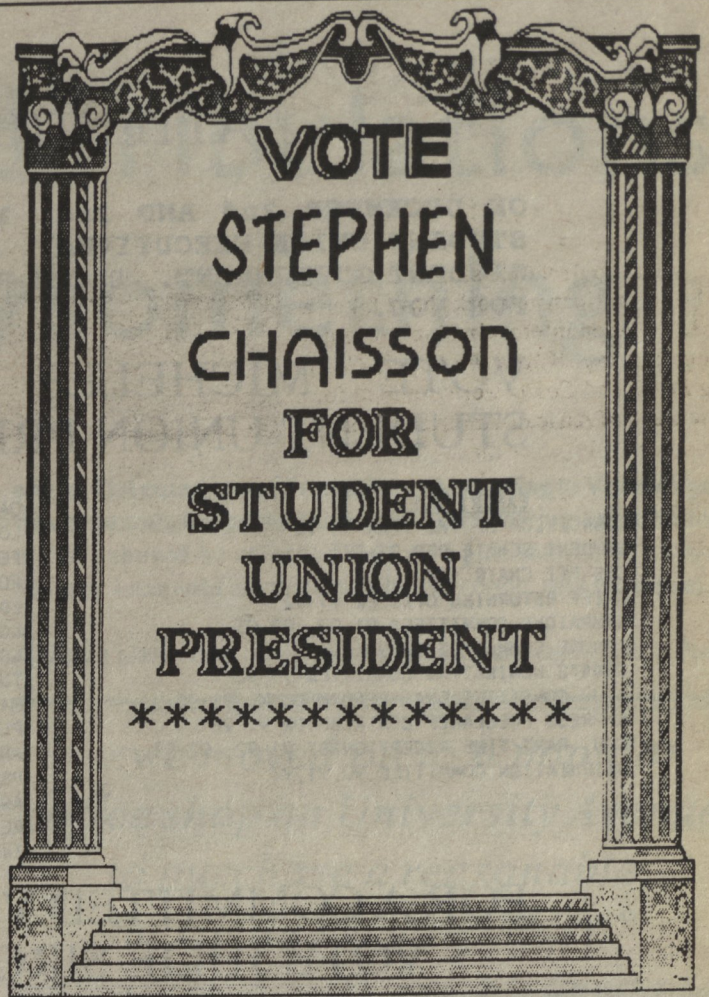
