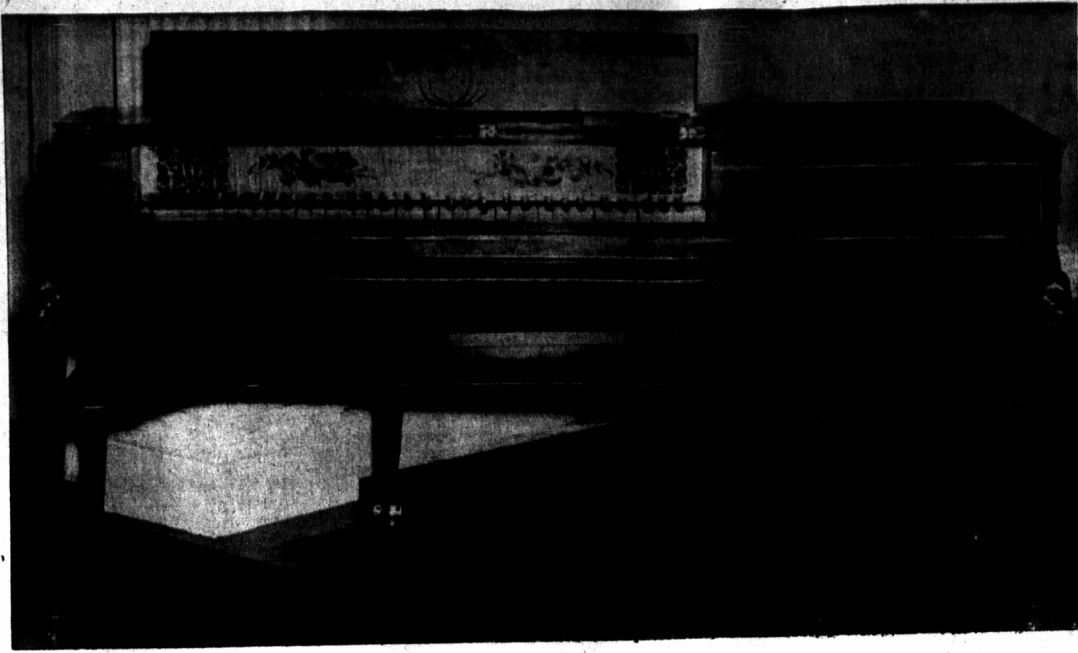

First Piano In P. E. I. At Government House

Shown above is the oldest piano in P. E. I., owned by Mrs. Earle Baker and now on loan at Government House as part of the Centennial historic exhibit. It was built by Muzio Clementi, a famous Italian pianist and composer of his own, Clementi and Co. The piano was brought over to the Island by Governor Patterson in 1770, and was sold when he was recalled back to England in 1786, finally to come into possession of the Baker family. It has only five and a half octaves as opposed to the present day seven and a third, but is a notable progression toward the modern piano since 1711, when the piano was invented by the Italian Bartolomneo Cristofori. Intensive Preparations For Air Show On Saturday

Already at the Charlottetown Airport preparations are going ahead full force for the big Centennial Air Show on Saturday. "A" hangar belonging to Maritime Central Airways is undergoing a colossal transformation in preparation of the display, which is being jointly sponsored by the RCAF Station, Summerside, and the Charlottetown Wing of the Air Force Association. The hangar will house the ground display in connection with the show and is an effort to make the public conscious of the importance of the work involved by ground crews and their equipment so that air craft may be kept flying. It has been said that it takes 10 men on the ground to keep one man in the air and Air Force officials believe that this proportion has been increased in favor of the ground crews during the past few years. The display will feature all of the equipment being used at Summerside, Greenwood and Chatham air bases, including messing supplies, photography, technical dis-

Bevan Expects To Regain Key Post In Party

LONDON (Reuters)—Left-Winger Aneurin Bevan Wednesday night counted upon regaining a key position in the Labor party's parli-

mentary leadership as voting ended for the 12 members of the "shadow cabinet." Labor's "bad boy," who narrowly escaped expulsion from the party only three months ago, was one of 54 candidates in balloting by the 277 Labor members of Parliament. Results will be announced tonight. Even moderate Socialists admitted Bevan would regain a seat in the shadow cabinet, which directs the party's day-to-day policy and tactics in the House of Commons and from which the new government would be formed in event of Labor victory.

PUBLIC NOTICE CIVIC BY-ELECTION

A Voters List has been prepared for the Civic By-Election to be held on Thursday, July 7th, 1955, and will be posted for the inspection of all Electors at the City Court Room, City Building up to and including Tuesday, July 5th, from 11:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. daily—Daylight Time, or, 10 A.M. to 4 P.M. Standard Time.

All persons, especially wives or husbands qualified to vote under (B) below, and men and taxpaying women voting on rental qualifications only, should see that they are registered with the Electoral Officer in order to have their names on the Voters List.

All Voters qualified as below must be 21 years of age, residents of the City for one year, (except non-residents occupying business premises), Canadian Citizens, and not in arrears at December 31st, 1954.

Qualified voters, subject to above are:

- (A) Owners or joint owners (for three months previous to Election day) of Real Estate in the City to the extent of \$500.00 assessed value.
- (B) Wife or husband of such an owner if the owner be entitled to vote.
- (C) Men renting premises in the City of a yearly rental of at least \$100.00 and having rented such in the City for the three months previous to Election Day.
- (D) Women renting premises as in (C) above, and who have been assessed for Civic Taxes for 1954, and not in arrears as above.
- (E) Residents of the City who have paid Poll Tax for the year 1954.
- (F) Non-residents of the City if otherwise qualified as above and doing business and occupying business premises in the City.

MULTIPLE VOTING

Persons voting on (A) (B) (C) (D) or (F) above may vote on the Ward in which they are resident.
Persons voting on (E) above may vote only in the Ward of which they are resident.
Property or rental qualifications having removed to another Ward within three months next preceding date of election, entitles vote in former Ward only.
