

**Militia General Order.**

CHARLOTTETOWN, Feb. 1867.

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF.

**1st Prince County Regiment of Militia.**

**T**HE following will be the District Limits, numerical order and officers of the several Companies of the above Regiment:—

- No. 1.—Capt. Daniel Woodside, Lieut. Alexander Stewart, Ensign John Montgomery. Precinct—Western Section—Princetown Royalty, west of Base Line and Princetown.
- No. 2.—Captain Edward Montgomery, Lieutenant Dugald Stewart McNutt, Ensign Peter Bearisto. Precincts—Eastern Section, Princetown Royalty—Lying east of Base Line and west of Darnley Bridge and River.
- No. 3.—Captain Francis Longworth McNutt, Lieut. James McNutt, Ensign Charles McNutt. Precinct—Northern Section of Lot 18—North of New London Road, thence to County Line.
- No. 4.—Captain James Maxwell McNutt, Lieutenant Peter McNutt, Ensign John Kier Bearisto. Precinct—East Centre Section, Lot 18—Lying between New London and Baltic Roads, thence to County Line, and that portion of Princetown Royalty east of Darnley Bridge and River.
- No. 5.—Capt. James Bearisto, Lieutenant George Sinclair, Ensign George Bearisto. Precinct—South Eastern Section of Lot 18—East of Town Road, South of Baltic Road, thence to County Line, via Indian River and Ramsay's Mill Road.
- No. 6.—Captain James Stewart, Lieut. Archibald Ramsay, Ensign James Ramsay. Precinct—South-west Section, Lot 18—West of the Shipyard Road, thence to shore of Oyster Cove.
- No. 7.—Captain Donald McLellan, Lieut. John McLellan, Ensign Bennett McLellan. Precinct—Centre Section of Lot 18—lying between Shipyard and Town Road, south of Royalty Line, thence to Indian River Bridge.
- No. 8.—Capt. William Jamieson, Lieut. David Jamieson, Ensign Donald McMullin. Precinct—South-west Section of Lot 19—West of Town Road, South of Indian River Bridge, thence to Line of Lot 25.
- No. 9.—Captain Thomas H. Sims, Lieut. Joseph Webster, Ensign Samuel Caseley. Precinct—North-eastern Section of Lot 19—North of the Margate Road, East of Town Road, South of Indian River and Ramsay's Mill Road, thence to County Line.
- No. 10.—Capt. John Glover, Lieut. Paul Thompson, Ensign William Bowness. Precinct—South-eastern Section of Lot 19—East of Freetown Road, South of Margate Road, thence to County Line and line of Lot 25; also, that part of Lot 25, East of Town Road to County Line.
