

Dowling & Don MacDonald Win Golf Championships

Two Charlottetown golfers swept to victories yesterday in the N.B.-P.E.I. Open and Amateur golf tournaments held at the Belvedere Golf Club.

Local professional Cecil Dowling rode to the open and professional championships while a comparatively unknown golfer by the name of Don MacDonald won the Amateur title.

All in all Charlottetown swingers had a bit of a field day Wednesday making history by placing three men on the Willingdon Cup team which travels to Winnipeg later this summer.

In addition to MacDonald and Beer veteran Art MacKenzie and Jack Beaton qualified by tying for third place honors. An 18-hole playoff will be arranged in the near future to decide which of the two will be named to the team.

Both will make the trip, however, for the loser will go along as the team spare.

The junior championship went to John Estabrooks of St. John's Westfield who hit the wire 5-stroke ahead of Ben Gray Jr. of Edmundston and six up on David Irving of Fredericton.

Established rounds of 81 and 82 Tuesday which combined with the previous scores of 81 and 82 gave him a total of 328 over the 72-hole distance.

The senior title fell to G.J. (Pete) Campbell of St. Croix. The veteran player carded a 54-hole total of 232, just one stroke ahead of Francis Mavor of Edmundston.

Dowling's victory came after a rather poor day by Bobby's standards. Going into the day's play he held a 7-stroke lead over Bathurst pro Pete Kelly.

Despite a 75 in the morning round, Dowling increased his spread to 10 strokes as Kelly fell off to a 78. Kentville pro Jimmy Walker scored a par 72 in the morning play and moved into a tie for second with Kelly as the pros moved into the final round.

WALKER HOT
Dowling coasted home in the final 18 with another 75 but saw his lead shaved 4 strokes as Walker blazed around in a one-under par 71, the best round played by anyone all day.

Walker's hot round gave him second place over Kelly who parred the course for a total of 288. Dowling's total was 291 and Walker's 297.

Other pros following in order were John Smith of Amherst and Alan Ogilvie of Moncton tied with 304; Don Sinclair of Riverside was next with 308 and George O'Donahue of Resigouette at 310.

Tuesday's pace-setters in the amateur ranks fell off in the morning round. Art MacKenzie and G.J. Campbell were leading after the second 18 holes with scores of 149. MacKenzie slipped to 82 in the third round and Campbell dropped to 83. While this top duo were skidding Don MacDonald and Bill Beer came along fast scoring 77 and 75 respectively to vault into a three stroke lead with totals of 227 going into the final 18 holes.

Following the leaders at this point were Robert Foley of Mon-

ton and Art MacKenzie with 231; G.J. Campbell and Frank MacInnis of Charlottetown at 232 and Francis Mavor, Ben Isner of Moncton and Doug Lewis also of Moncton at 233. MacInnis came in to the afternoon picture firing the best round among the amateurs in the morning - a 74.

MacDonald and Beer were in a trio with Foley of Moncton for the final 18 and it soon became apparent that it was going to be a fight between the Charlottetown duo for the coveted crown.

MATCH STROKES
They matched stroke for stroke over the early holes but by the 15th, MacDonald had pulled into a 4-stroke lead. Beer won the 16 and 17 with birdies but MacDonald sank a 35-foot putt to maintain 2-stroke spread into the final hole. Beer parred the last

hole and MacDonald sank a short putt for a 5.

MacDonald at 31 will be making his first trip to the Willingdon Cup play. A golfer for 10 years he played through the entire tournament with a badly cut right hand which interfered with his play considerably.

Playing on a cup team is nothing new for Pud Beer who has won places on three others. Pud represented N.B. and P.E.I. previously in 1947, 1951 and 1955.

In addition to winning a hatful of individual titles Charlottetown's golfers swept first place and runner-up spot in the team battles. A team composed of Beer, MacDonald, Frank MacInnis and Art MacKenzie placed first while another quartet composed of Merin MacKenzie, Wendell Gump, Gils
