N. Y. Stock Market Meets 10-Year Record

NEW YORK, April 23 - (AP) - The stock market last week did the biggest business in 10 years. More than 15,000,000 shares of stock changed hands in the exchange, a total not matched since May 1940.

Trading activity centred on radio-television issues and a group of low-priced and speculative shares. Blue-chip stocks were not ignored but only a few attracted a large following.

Possibly the outstanding features of the market were the evident increases in speculation activity and trading by the general public.

In Saturday's two-hour session the market made a brief try for higher prices and then thought better of it.

On the Curb, Giant Yellowknife moved ahead 1-8. Royalite Oil and Imperial Oil Co. (coupon) were unchanged.

Prices Advance Slowly On Toronto Exchange

TORONTO, April 23 - (CP) - Moderate demand pulled prices slowly higher in Saturday's short session on the Toronto Stock Exchange.

Western oils showed an almost solid list of gains as the list pulled up from recent declines.

Late buying in junior gold producers pulled golds onto firmer ground. Seniors were down fractions.

United Keno hit 110 in high-light base metals, adding 15 cents at \$4.85.

The exchange's closing index showed golds up .28 at 101.52, base metals up .13 at 116.15, western oils up .72 at 71.07.

Dulles Would Recognize Red Gov't In China

By CHARLES A. GRUMICH LAKE SUCCESS, N. Y., April 23 - (AP) - John Foster Dulles, Republican adviser to the United States Department of State, con-

tinued in a new book that the Red China Government should be admitted to the United Nations if it can rule without serious internal resistance.

His "War or Peace", a 247-page review and preview of the cold war, to be published tomorrow, thus touches on the greatest immediate question that has brought the U.N. to a stalemate.

Russia is boycotting 20 U. N. organs that have met this year. The Russians are protesting the continued presence of Nationalist China delegates here and the majorities refusal to throw them out in favor of the Reds.

Dulles, who was appointed April 6 to an advisory post in the State Department, comments on Communist China in these words in a chapter appealing for "universality" of membership in the U.N.

"If the Communist Government of China in fact proves its ability to govern China without serious domestic resistance, then it, too, should be admitted to the United Nations. However, a regime that claims to have become the government of a country through civil war should not be recognized until it has been tested over a reasonable period of time."

Dulles predicts the Communist China regime will eventually fail in the economic and social fields and will fail to make good its propaganda pledges. He laments the ironic post-war developments that have let a Communist Government rise in a country that became officially a big power in the U.N. at the insistence of the late President Roosevelt.

"All that the United States did to enhance the prestige of China and to give it a leading position in the United Nations and in the world may now be turned against us," Dulles says.
