Chef's Gourmet Dinner Pleases Eye And Palate

During the winter season, the Chef and I were entertained in several cities at gourmet dinners. In general, the same type menu was prepared under the supervision of the executive chef of the individual hotel and, I may add, always with success.

When served, however, the foods varied somewhat in appearance and in taste, just as one homemaker's cake differs from her neighbor's, although the same recipe is used by both.

William Russell, brilliant young executive chef at the Hotel du Pont in Wilmington, Delaware, came up with a well-nigh perfect dinner.

MERINGUES MANGO

I was particularly pleased with his interpretation of Meringues Mango, the dessert in which individual meringue shells are layered with diced mangoes, mounded with vanilla ice cream, dusted with grated fresh coconut and decorated with colorful glace fruits.

Young Chef Russell turned out the prettiest ice cream meringue dessert I've ever seen. He baked the meringues in the form of round nests 1½" deep, then filled each with 3 small balls of ice cream, dusted on coconut and near the top, like rare jewels, placed a few small cubes of shining colorful glace fruit.

TABLE DECOR

The central decoration of Chef Russell's long dinner table was a remarkable arrangement of fruits, vegetables and green leaves, which could be duplicated for a Spring church or club dinner.

The fruits and vegetables were wired or taped, as necessary, on to a two-tier wooden tray or stand. At top, was a pineapple, red radishes tucked in its green leaves. Rosy apples, lemons and grapes were arranged around the base of the pineapple, together with spears of red radishes strung on wire.

The second layer consisted of

grapefruit, green leaves, grapes, bananas and spears of pearly fresh mushrooms strung on wires.

The base, arranged on the tablecloth, was a combination of all the fruits used, along with avocados, green leaves, red cabbage leaves and mushrooms.

Sunday dinner for guests—French onion soup, filet mignon, or chopped beef patties, hollandaise stuffed mushrooms, sweet potatoes beignets, spinach (Romaine seasoning) meringues mango, coffee, tea, milk. Measurements are level; recipes for 6.

Chopped beef patés hollandaise or filet mignon: For each person, sauté 1 medium-size filet mignon or chopped beef sirloin patty in butter. Spread top with hollandaise sauce. Slip under broiler 1 min. to brown.

Garnish each with sautéed mushroom crown dusted with minced parsley. Arrange on rounds of toast. Accompaniment: broiled mushrooms.

Fish steaks hollandaise: Sauté individual steaks; finish and garnish with broiled mushroom crown. Serve each on slice of grilled crumbed eggplant.

Sweet potato beignets: Prepare

3 c. whipped, cooked, Jersey sweet potatoes.

Season with 1 tsp. salt, ¼ tsp. white pepper and ¼ tsp. fine-grated lemon rind. Whip in two tbsp. melted butter and 2 beaten egg yolks. Chill.

Form into marble-size balls or cylinder shapes. Dust with flour. Roll in 1 egg beaten with 1 tsp. water, then in ¼ c. fine dry

bread crumbs mixed with ¼ c. fine-chopped blanched almonds.

Deep-fry in corn oil at 375 degrees F. Drain on crumpled paper. Arrange in next form on round platter.

TOMORROW'S DINNER

Egg-celery-ondive, tossed saladettes, fish steak hollandaise, on broiled eggplant slices, potato

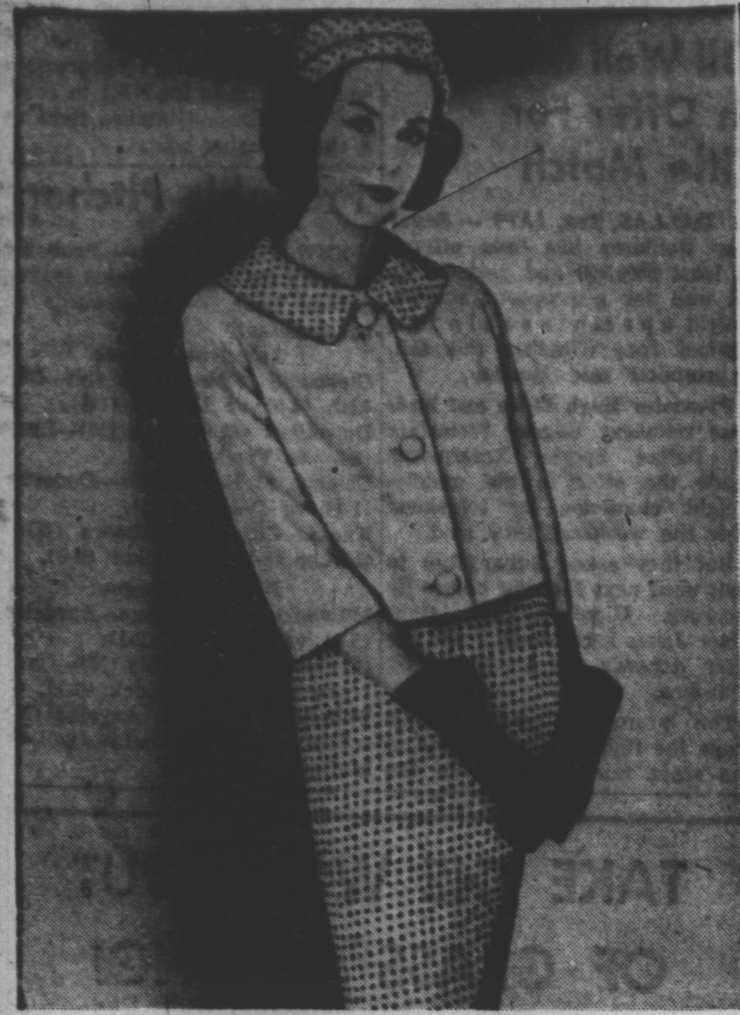
puffs, new bests vinaigrette, lemon cake pudding, coffee, tea, milk.

TRACK OF THE CHEF

Dust fish steaks with a ¼ tsp. powdered dill before broiling.

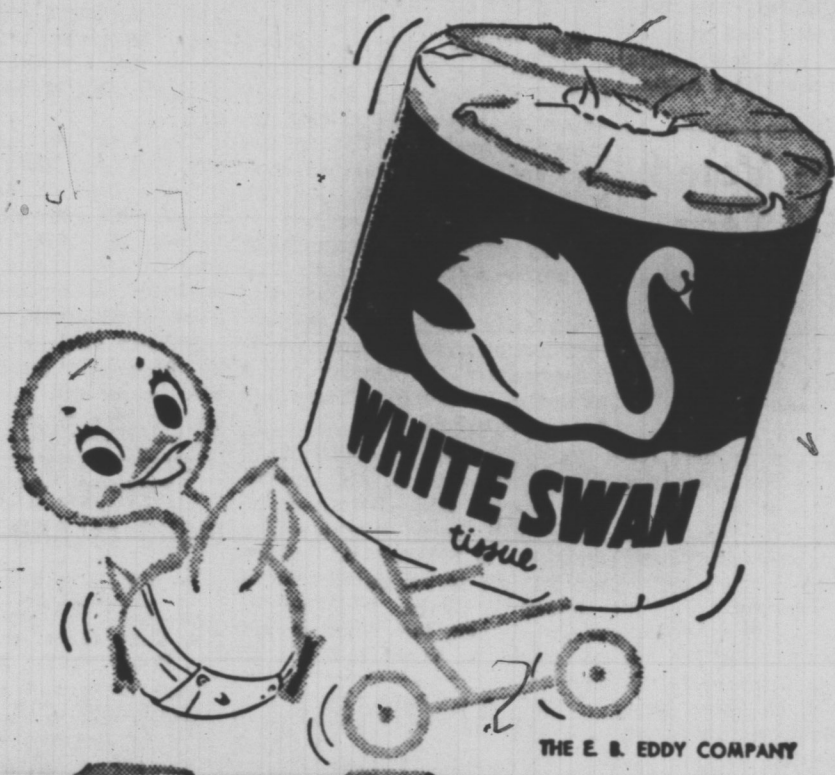

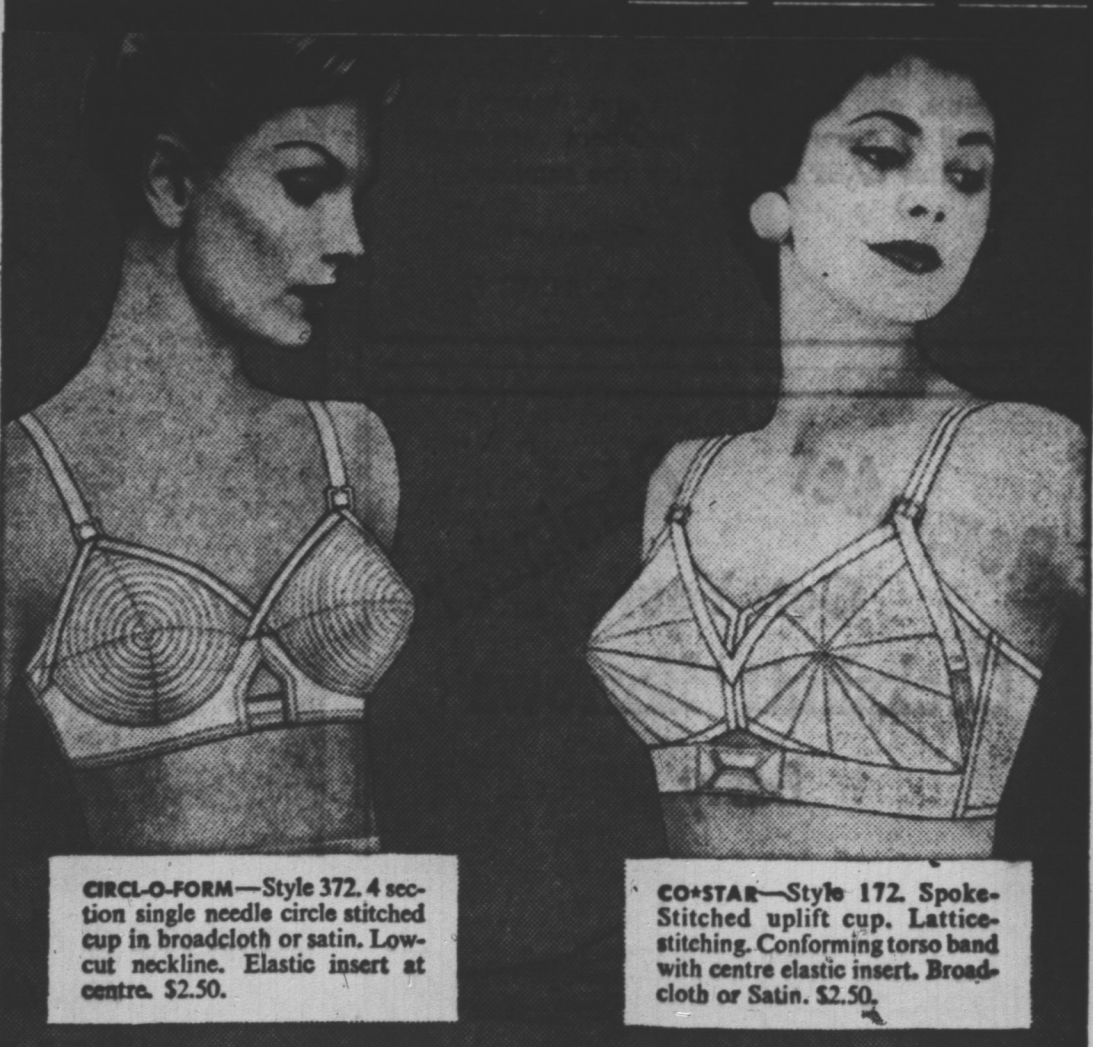
