By TONY ESCODA RANGOON (AP)—Democratic government in Burma hinges on one man whose name signifies "gentleness"—Premier U Nu. This, qualified observers say, could spell trouble in the next few years.

RETURNED STRONGER

But when the army bowed out a little more than a year later, Burmese voters returned Nu to office in a landslide victory that amazed even some of his supporters.

IN FULL CONTROL

Major policy decisions are usually left to him. The premier—a devout Buddhist who has been known to go off on meditations for as long as 45 days—is not prone to taking rapid or firm action.
