**Resignation Of Custodians May Be Threat To Playhouse**

FREDERICTON (CP) — The chairman of the board of governors of the Playhouse says he does not think the Playhouse will lose its \$100,000 grant because of the resignations of Lady Beaverbrook and Sir Max Aitken as custodians. Judge C. J. A. Hughes was commenting Thursday on a Wednesday statement by Fredericton publisher Michael Wardell that the late Lord Beaverbrook's widow and son would no longer be custodians. Mr. Wardell told a meeting of Patrons of the Playhouse that he was resigning as treasurer of the \$1,000,000 Playhouse donated to the province by Lord Beaverbrook and the Sir James Dunn Foundation. Premier Robichaud was unavailable for comment Thursday and his office said he was with Sir Max. The office refused to say where the two men could be reached. The dispute was apparently triggered by the serving of liquor to some of the audience attending the closed circuit television showing of the Cassius Clay-Sonny Liston heavyweight championship fight at the Playhouse. Mr. Wardell said he had received a special party permit from the Liquor Control Board. He said the premier told Lady Beaverbrook and Sir Max that "I operated a bar in the Playhouse . . . in defiance of the regulations" of the Liquor Control Board. Mr. Wardell also criticized the board of governors for discharging theatre Director Alexander Gray on six months notice. Nigeria, a country of 55,000,000 people, has 1,000 doctors and 50 dentists.

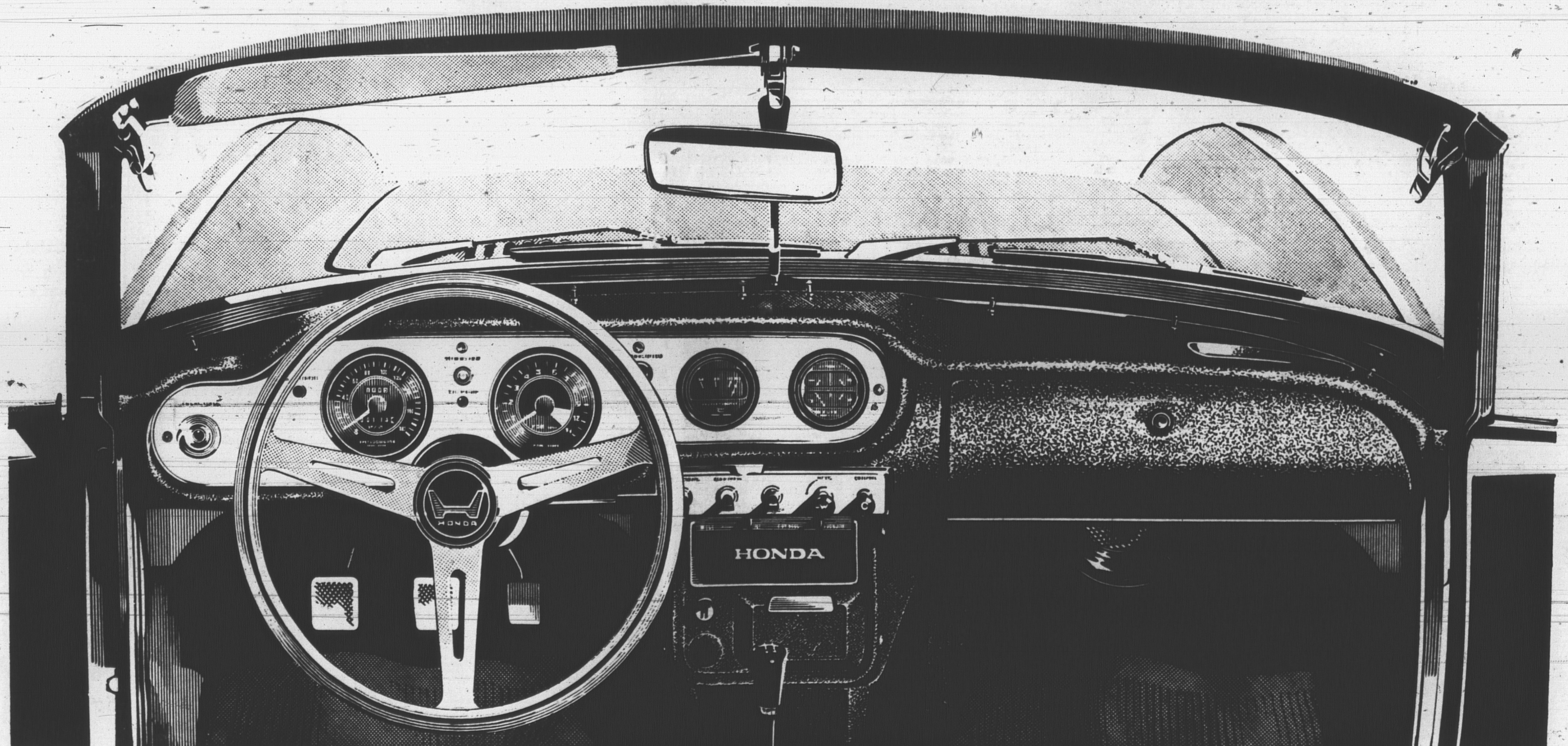

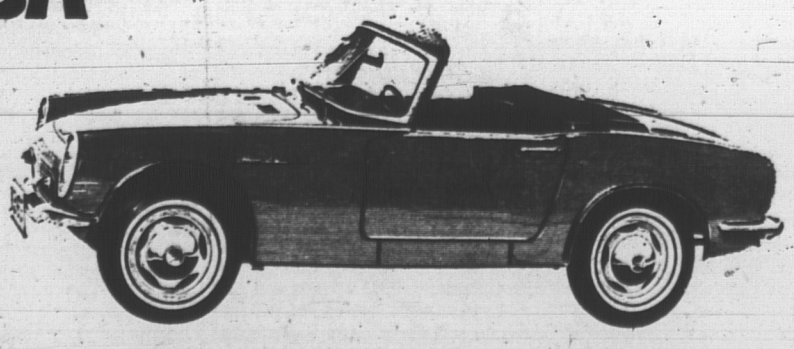
