Smallpox Storm Drowns Timely

THIS COUNTRY owes the existence of two of its better known families to the quick thinking of a canny Scot who captured the Romulus that brought John Ferguson and others across the Atlantic more than 200 years ago...
The Romulus was somewhere in the Atlantic in the summer of 1807 when it did not stop by an English warship which put an officer and several men aboard looking for men for the navy...
The Ferguson's, I understand, played a part in having the Robertsons come to this country...
The Romulus reached Pictou May 1, 1807, an old diary reveals, and the Ferguson's and others...
The menfolk chartered a boat that reached Charlottetown on a bleak, rainy day in May and the ship was almost lost with all aboard, when it ran into a vicious storm on the way back to Pictou...
The Ferguson's settled in Marshfield on the "Craggan" farm as they called it...
Donald Ferguson later bought the "Tulloch" farm, now owned by H. Lyle Rossall who still uses the name for his registered herd of Scotch Short-horn...
Mrs. Crosby and her late husband H. Marshfield...
Donald Ferguson imported a herd of Galway cattle from Ireland and Mrs. Crosby recalls that they were beef animals black in color, and her father once had several stein rosbags...

Prominent in P.E.I., Canadian History

Two American Teams Meet At Top Of Mount Everest

By ALAN M. KENNEDY — KATHMANDU, Nepal (AP) — The American Mt. Everest expedition jubilantly announced Thursday that two of its teams met near the top of the world's highest mountain Wednesday after scaling it from two different sides...
It was the first such meeting, the first time anyone had ever made it successfully up the perilous West Ridge, the first time anyone went up one side, crossed the top and started down the other side and the first time any country had four of its citizens atop Everest on one day...
"We are all very proud," said U.S. Ambassador Henry Endicott Stephens when expedition chief Norman R. Dyhrenfurth of Santa Monica, Calif., flashed the news here by radio...
Traverse of the summit, said Dyhrenfurth, has been "the dream of mountaineers for decades...
He said Barry C. Bishop of Washington, D.C., and Luther G. Jerstad of Eugene, Ore., reached the summit via the traditional South Ridge...
They looked for William F. Unsworth of Corvallis, Ore., and Thomas F. Hornbin of San Diego, Calif., who they knew were struggling toward the 29,028-foot peak up the previously un conquered West Ridge...
Not seeing them, they turned to go down and then discovered the other two had reached the summit, crossed the top and also started down the south side...
MEET NEAR TOP — The four met at the South Summit, slightly lower than the peak which all had scaled...
The meeting was at 8 p.m. and darkness was rapidly setting in. The climbers were unable to find camp — at 27,600 feet — in the dark and were forced to bivouac outdoors at 26,000 feet without tents, without sleeping bags and probably without oxygen...
Thursday they set out again. An expedition spokesman in Kathmandu emphasized that Unsworth and Hornbin accomplished their feat at great personal risk...
They pushed to the summit from the previously unclimbed West Ridge when they had no line of retreat behind them. There were no oxygen supplies cached there and no ropes left along the steep rocky places they had come up with difficulty...
So the two Americans carried off that Dyhrenfurth called "mountaineers' dream" of going up one way, crossing the summit and coming down another way...
Dyhrenfurth, a Swiss-born U.S. citizen and veteran of five Himalayan expeditions, radioed his happiness: "We are particularly happy and proud of our men who not only made the first Himalayan traverse but that this traverse was made on Everest...
Counting James Whitaker of Redmond, Wash., who made a successful ascent May 1, five Americans have reached the top of Everest. This is more than any other country has placed at the peak...
Base camp reported that all four who reached the summit Wednesday were in good health. They were between the 25,000 and 21,500-foot levels on the way down at the last radio contact Thursday...
This route along the South Ridge was also taken by the British expedition led by Sir John Hunt, which made the first conquest of Everest on the eve of Queen Elizabeth's coronation in 1953. It was followed by a Swiss team in 1956 and by the American expedition May 1...
Hunt said in London Thursday that if both American teams made it, it would be a signal achievement. Such a feat, he added, would place mountaineers everywhere, would be remembered in the Hall of Fame.

Price Increase Is Expected On Pop, Candy

HALIFAX (CP) — Prices of certain brands of soft drinks and candy will cost more because of rising sugar prices, spokesmen for two Halifax firms said Thursday...
Leroy E. Otha, vice president and general manager of Moore Limited, a large confectionery firm, said an increase on practically all of the firm's products is "definitely imminent"...
He said company officials are considering the extent of the increase and when it would take effect...
He said the firm had "gone about as far as we can" towards reducing the weight of certain types of candy. Depending on the type, candy may contain anywhere up to 100 per cent sugar, he said...
A spokesman for the Halifax branch of one national bottling company, said the price of the firm's soft drink is being raised immediately by 20 cents for a 24-bottle case. This would result in a two-cent price increase to the consumer to 12 cents from 10...
The spokesman said vending machines dispensing the drink at 10 cents a bottle presented a problem in making the change in price...
A second soft-drink bottler announced a price increase effective Thursday on products sold in the Halifax area.
