Work On Fishermen's Wharf At Borden Gets Under Way

Dr. Orville Phillips, member of Parliament for Prince County, announced yesterday that work on Fishermen's wharf at Borden is now under way and it is expected that work will be completed early next summer, in time for the fishing season. Contractors for the project are J.W. and J.N. Anderson of Burt Church, N.B. and the estimated amount of the contract is \$161,000-00. The length of the wharf is to be 844 feet, with a roadway leading to it from the Main Street, and with a parking area on the wharf level. The contract also calls for the construction of a storage shed 150 X 20 feet. It will be recalled the J. Watson MacNaught, while parliamentary assistant to the Minister of Fisheries, in the previous government, announced that this item had been tabled in the Federal estimates.
