This is the 5th time Sally has qualified in the Record of Performance, she having given 502 lbs. fat from 14614 lbs. milk as a two-year-old, 691 lbs. fat from 18465 lbs. milk as a three-year-old, 691 lbs. fat from 19045 lbs. milk as a five-year-old and 806 lbs. fat from 20840 lbs. milk as a six year old. With the exception of her latest record, she has been milked twice daily throughout.
