Diesel Engine Makes Trial Run

MONCTON, N. B., March 7 - (CP) - While coal black locomotives puffed plumes of smoke into the clear blue sky, scores gathered at the Moncton railway depot here this morning to watch a shiny blue, silver and gold diesel locomotive rumble quietly in without the characteristic dense trail that is associated with trains. Hauling the Maritime unit to Moncton a few minutes behind schedule, the big diesel had experienced no trouble on the run from Montreal. The engineer, L. K. Reid, of Moncton, and his fireman, Carl McKinley, also of Moncton, were enthusiastic in their praise of the new locomotive, which is to make a series of test runs between Montreal and Halifax. "Clearer vision, no trouble watching steam pressure and a fine ride," is the way Mr. Reid summed up his trip. With the railway for 39 years and a locomotive engineer since 1917 he showed none of the prejudice a man who grew up with steam engines might have been expected to voice. Willis Fraser, Truro and Fraser Muir, Truro, took over as driver and fireman, respectively, when the Maritime pulled out of Moncton to conclude its run to Halifax. Philip Matheson, transportation engineer, C.N.R., Montreal, was among the officials who travelled on the test run. He, too, was enthusiastic. Mr. Matheson explained that the three-unit engine was able to run with only two of its 1,500-horse-power units. "It travelled at 60 miles per hour without any difficulty," he said, "and it is estimated that it used about three gallons of oil per mile."

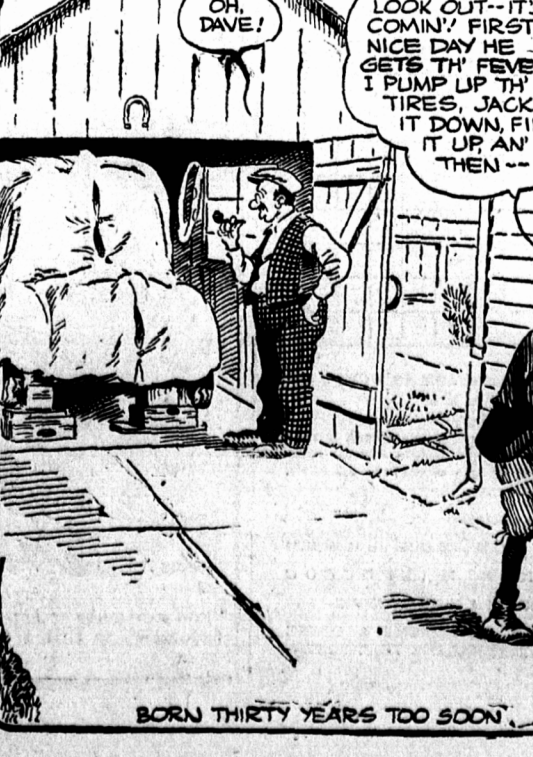
