

**MARITIME HARNESS RACING**

**MONCTON (CP)** — Sister Marie, an import from Ohio, reeled off a 2:10.4 mile Saturday dash at Brunswick Downs — fastest effort on the nine-mile card.

The nine-year-old bay mare, owned by Monctonian Charlie Letcher, also won another dash in 2:12.

Bob Steeves, a 39-year-old reinsman from Hillsboro, N.B., scored a driving triple when he won both dashes of the featured invitational pace with Jarret-town Lady and picked up a single with Betsy Truax. Jarret-town Lady's winning times were 2:13 and 2:12.

Other winners were Lorraine G. Henley (2:17.3), Betty Federal (2:15.1), Miss Fury (2:16.3) and Time's Lad in 2:17.

The victory by Miss Fury was the first time a Newfoundland horse has won a race in New Brunswick. The mare is owned by William MacGillivray of Gander and was driven by Kitchener Fox.

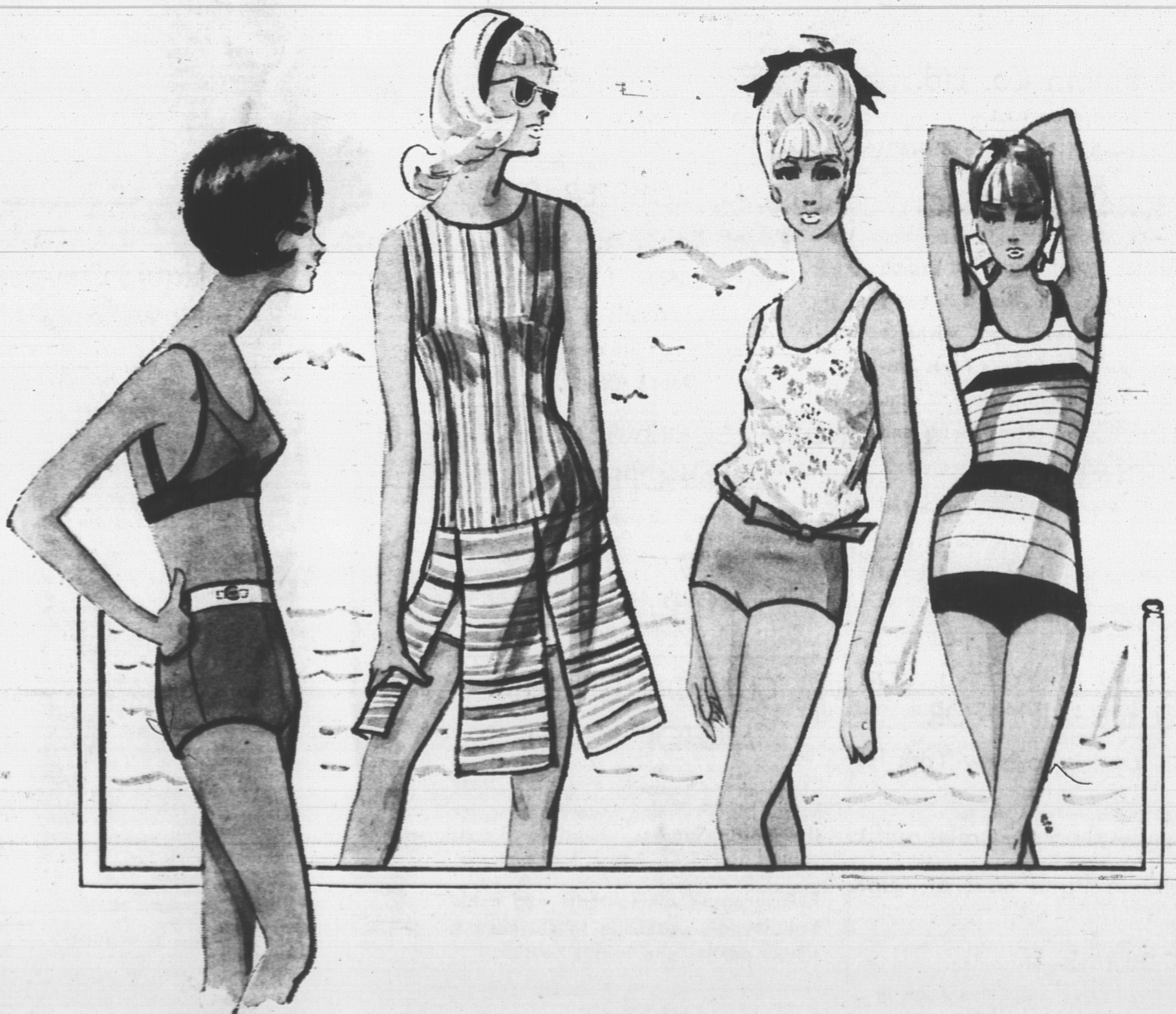
