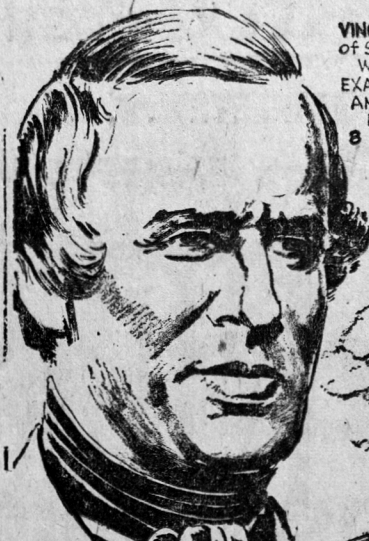

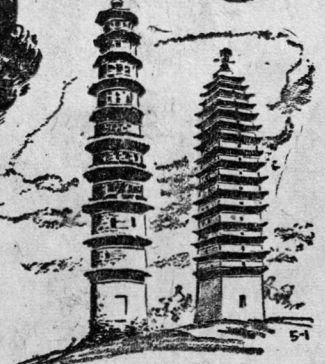

CONTRACT BRIDGE

The bidding: South West North East 1 Pass 3 Pass 2 Pass 4 Pass 6 Pass

Opening lead - two of diamonds. The endplay is one of the most common forms of gaining a trick which might otherwise be lost.

In a great many hands, the cards are so dealt that all declarers has to do is take advantage of the ready-made setup for an endplay to accomplish his purpose. Once declarer recognizes the position, practically all that is required is a flick of the wrist and the deed is done.

A more difficult challenge arises when the endplay position has to be created by declarer. An excellent example of this is furnished by today's hand where ordinary methods, such as clearing

all the spades and clubs from both hands and playing a heart from dummy, would fail. A trump is led and declarer sees that East has dealt the king of hearts the slam is sure to make.

The chance that a heart finesse would succeed, if attempted, is only a 50-50 proposition. The idea is to try to make the hand even if West has the king of hearts. As little should be left to luck as possible.

Accordingly, after taking two rounds of trumps, the A-K of spades are first cashed to see if by any chance the queen falls. No miracle having occurred, the A-K of clubs are next led. South discarding his spade loser.

A club is now ruffed, the first step in the elimination of the black suits. Dummy is then entered with a trump and the jack of spades is led. When East follows low, South does not ruff it, but instead, discards his low heart.

Declarer, if he wishes, can now spread his cards, claiming the balance, since any return by West is bound to be fatal. A heart led by West would be up to South's A-Q, while a club return could be ruffed in dummy as declarer disposed of the queen of hearts.

The method of play presented wins whenever West has the queen of spades. If East has the queen, the heart finesse is still available.
