

Longtime Resident Dies In Hospital

Spurgeon MacNeill, longtime resident of Charlottetown, died yesterday at the Prince Edward Island Hospital after a brief illness in his 72 year.

Mr. MacNeill, son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Bernard MacNeill, formerly from Belfast, was born in Charlottetown in 1894.

He moved to Knutsford in 1905 where he received his education and later joined the Army and served overseas with the 105 Battalion during World War I.

Following the war he returned to Knutsford and was employed as for-man painter with the Canadian National Railroad.

Mr. MacNeill served with the Veterans during the Second World War and later returned to Charlottetown where he was again employed with the CNR until his retirement in 1959.

Mr. MacNeill lived at home, 231 Richmond Street, until the time of his death.

Active as a deacon in the First Baptist Church, Charlottetown, Mr. MacNeill was also a member of the Royal Canadian Legion.

Surviving is his wife, the former Mary Louise Lidstone of Knutsford, now residing in Charlottetown.

Also surviving are daughters: Daisy, Mrs. Frank Thomson, Highfield; Lyla, Mrs. John Kavanagh, Queensville, Ont.; Gloria,

Mrs. Wendell Burhoe, 231 Richmond St., and Chauncey, 220 Belvedere Avenue.

Other survivors include sisters: Annie, Mrs. Arthur Harris, O'Leary, and Daisey, Mrs. Estabrook, Chicago, Illinois.

A son, two brothers and a sister predeceased him.

Funeral service will be held Sunday at 2:30 p.m. from the First Baptist Church. Interment in People's Cemetery.

HALIFAX (CP) — The weather office says mild, moist air still covered all of the district late Thursday and was causing extensive fog, especially in coastal areas.
