THE steamer "M. A. Starr" sailed for Halifax yesterday evening with a cargo consisting of 100 bbls. potatoes, 24 bags oats, and 7 bbls. oysters.

SIR WILLIAM and Lady Young have just arrived in Halifax, after an extensive tour through the United States and Upper Provinces.

MILITARY.—Drafts for the regiments in garrison are expected to arrive by the troopship "Tamar," which is expected to arrive here about the 15th inst. The 26th Company R. Engineers will proceed to Bermuda by H. M. S. "Tamar" in the course of the month.—Hx. Herald.

JOHN FERGUSON, vagrant, took refuge in the lock-up last night, and was discharged today. It is a pity the authorities should allow this helpless invalid to loiter about the city. He is a sickening sight to all who pass him. Cannot something be done to take him off the streets?

PRODUCE SHIPMENTS.—On Wednesday last the schooner "John Franklin" cleared from Montague for Newfoundland with a cargo consisting of 1182 bushels oats, 192 bushels turnips. On Tuesday the schooner "Hannah G" sailed from New London for St. John's, Nfld., with 1900 bushels oats, 405 bushels barley, 600 bushels potatoes, 18 tubs butter, 16 bags oatmeal.

THE barque "Lizzie Cameron" sailed this morning from Crapaud to load coal at Pictou for Montreal. This vessel has been in Crapaud for some days intending to load oats at that port for Great Britain, but the voyage has been abandoned. Our reporter, hearing that the voyage was abandoned, called upon the owners—Messrs. Welsh & Owen—to learn the reason. He was informed by Mr. Owen "that the freight arranged for from Montreal was much better than anything the vessel could do in taking oats from this Province, on ship's account, at the present prices."

THE lecture of the Rev. Jacob Freshman, on "The Jews," which will be delivered in Y. M. C. A. Hall, on Monday evening, is very highly spoken of by the press of the cities in which it has been delivered. Rev. Mr. Evans, of Fredericton, writes: "The lecture is brimful of information on a subject not often brought before our people. In a glowing manner the prayers of the Jews are described. This description is one of the most beautiful and eloquent parts of the lecture. Whether we consider the interest surrounding the subject, the method of its treatment, or the fervid eloquence of the lecturer, it is one of the best and most useful lectures I have listened to." His Honor Judge Hensley will preside; and it is anticipated that, as in other places, the hall here will be full.

JOHN W. MATHESON, truckman, was, today, arraigned before the Stipendiary Magistrate for receiving hay on false pretences. At the market, yesterday, he purchased a load of hay from a young man named Terrence Carrahar—a servant in the employ of Mr. Wm. Howard—and promised to pay him in cash when the hay would be stored. Carrahar immediately stored the hay in Matheson's barn, and on demanding his money, Matheson told him to "go to h—l and get it." The young man remonstrated with him, but getting no satisfaction, he made complaint at the Court, and Matheson was arrested. He denied the charge at the Court this morning, and said he bought the hay on some condition made between Dr. Creamer and Carrahar's master—"a condition" which was, no doubt, of Matheson's own invention. The Magistrate warned him that if he again appeared on a like charge he would fine him heavily. This time he ordered him to return the hay to Carrahar, and pay him 60 cents for his trouble, besides 75 cents Court expenses.

THOMAS ENMAN and JAMES FARADY, two noted thieves, were arrested by the police on Thursday evening. There is a batch of complaints against each, and they have alluded the vigilance of the police for months. Enman has often relieved the clothes-lines of the east and north-ends of the city of their burdens, and committed many other larcenies. Farady has stolen more or less from the Gas Works. For some motive they disguised themselves on Thursday evening, about seven o'clock, and passed the police station. The City Marshal detected them and sent officers Cameron and Bradley in pursuit. Officer Cameron discharged his revolver in the air; and Farady, thinking it was at him, jumped over the fence in front of Mrs. Alexander's residence and hid. He was soon captured by officer Bradley. Enman turned up Pownal street. At the corner of Grafton and Pownal Streets officer Cameron discharged the second shot in the air; but it failed to daunt Enman, and he continued his flight. When opposite the Convent the officer threatened to shoot him if he would not surrender. Enman, on hearing the threat, immediately stopped and returned to the station with the officer. Yesterday they were remanded to jail for eight days, in order to prepare the necessary evidence against them for their many offences.
