SHIP LESS STEEL CLEVELAND (AP) — Despite the American steel strike, which virtually halted iron ore shipping on the Great Lakes for about four months, total freight tonnage handled by lake shippers to Dec. 1 was down only six per cent from the comparable period of 1958. The lake carriers association reported Friday that 105,125,970 net tons were shipped to Dec. 1 this year, compared with 122,290,965 tons for 1958.

NOTES ON FUR FARMING
 Fromm Bros., Inc., sale at Hamburg, Wisconsin, early last week was a great success. One third of the approximately 4,000 fox pelts offered were sold. Silvers sold best, with most lots selling in the \$31 to \$37 range. A few of the top lots brought \$45, new Golden Amber types brought a top price of \$70, while top price for Golden Glory was \$57. Platitudes, white faces and pearls were not so interesting to the buyers.
 Edward Fromm, president of the firm, said: "The fox sale was most encouraging, despite limited numbers of buyers." In Mr. Fromm's report of the mink sale he said that the offering of 39,000 skins was 90 percent sold. Homo-pastels and blues were better than 95 percent sold, and brought better prices than the opening sale in December, 1958. Gun metal types were all sold with females bringing somewhat higher prices than last December. Whites were up somewhat in price, and nearly all sold. Sapphires sold at last December's sale level; home-sapphires were slightly stronger and 80 to 85 percent sold.
 Fromm reported that silver blues sold well at slightly higher prices than last December, but standard darks were 75 percent sold at somewhat easier prices. "We consider the sale a very good one." Mr. Fromm claimed, "prices generally were stronger than those of last year's opening sale."
MINK IN DEMAND
 Evidence of a strong market in mink was displayed at the auction of Canadian Fur Auction Sales Company (Quebec) Limited last week at Montreal. The EMBA sale saw interest in darks and pastels maintained, with prices in some cases even stronger. Clearances across the board were high.
 Majestic darks sold 90 percent, unlabelled darks sold 99 percent, autumn haze sold 85 percent, and their unlabelled counterparts sold 97 percent. Topaz and diadem, were completely sold, while desert gold went at an 87 percent clip. Demand for cerulean was somewhat more limited, though prices for good quality skins also were seen to hold up well. Sapphires and whites were also sold, but we have no comment on them.
 The majority of the purchases in top grades appeared to go to accounts in Germany, Italy and Switzerland, though Canadian and American buyers, of course, were represented.
 The official company comment was: "Majestic darks, 90 percent sold, very firm; unlabelled darks, 99 percent sold; autumn haze, 87 percent sold."
QUALITY DOWN
 The Soudack sale, held last week in Winnipeg, has released a statement as follows: "Percentage of top goods was not as large as in other types, but some lots sold around the \$30 mark, with better average males at \$25 to \$26, and ordinary average at \$23 to \$24. Very few were below \$20."
 "Females sold well, with the big percentage at \$12 to \$13, and better selections at \$13.25 to \$14.50. Desert gold brought from \$25 to \$26 for males, and \$13 to \$14 for females. Diadem were \$23 for males and \$12 to \$13 for females. Jasmine brought less interest than expected, but some better lots changed hands at \$32 to \$33.50 for males. There was not too much activity on albatrosses, where the top was \$30. Tourmalinae was the hot spot of the sale, with many buyers keenly competing for the offering. Best males brought \$37 to \$38.50, and others mostly \$34 to \$36. Females were also strong, with most better lots at \$18 to \$20, others at \$16 to \$17."
 The Western Canada Raw Fur Auction Sales wound up its new season's opening mink sale last week in Vancouver, with large collections of sapphires and pastels moving at prices generally unchanged from a year ago. The company estimates that close to 75 percent of the total offering of 90,000 skins was sold.
 Breath of spring type males brought a high of \$33 and females \$16. Royal males sold at a high of \$26 and females at \$13. The collection of 35,000 pastels was 75 percent sold, with a high of \$35 for males, and \$16 for females.
