THE JAMES C. CUMMING FELLOWSHIP. Awarded to a recent graduate in Arts and Science of any accredited University.

THE COLLEGE FELLOWSHIPS (three in number). Awarded to recent graduates in Arts and Science or Divinity of any accredited University.

THE PROVOST SEELEY FELLOWSHIP (two in number) Awarded to graduates who are not Canadians and are graduates of accredited Universities outside Canada.

Final date for receipt of applications, FEBRUARY 1. **FRANK KNOX MEMORIAL FELLOWSHIPS - HARVARD UNIVERSITY**

The Fellows will be required to devote the major part of their time to study in one of the Faculties of Harvard University: Arts and Sciences (including Engineering), Business Administration, Design, Divinity, Education, Law, Public Administration, (John F. Kennedy School of Government), Medicine, Dental Medicine and Public Health. The University will try to arrange a course suitable to the requirement of the Fellow.

Value: \$3,400 plus tuition fees.

Number: Two

Duration: One academic year.

These fellowships are

open to Canadian citizens who have graduated or who are about to graduate from a university or college in Canada, which is a member or affiliated to a member of the Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada. No application will be considered from a student already in the United States. Candidates are responsible for gaining admission to Harvard University by the deadline set by the various faculties. Results of this competition will not be announced until April of the following year. Tenable at Harvard University.

DEADLINE: DECEMBER 1. ONTARIO GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM 1978-79

The Ontario Graduate Scholarship Program of the Ministry of Colleges and Universities is designed to encourage excellence in graduate studies. In the 1978-79 academic year, up to 1200 scholarships will be awarded to students as follows:

- the Selection Board may recommend up to 1155 awards which will be tenable at the Ontario university of the students' choice.
- in addition, Brock, Lakehead, Laurentian, Trent and Wilfrid Laurier Universities may each nominate up to nine students who, if they meet the citizenship requirements and are approved by the Selection Board, will receive scholarships tenable only at the nominating university.

To be eligible for an Ontario Graduate Scholarship, students must intend to pursue graduate studies at an Ontario university. The scholarship is not tenable outside the Province. Applicants must have a high level of academic achievement, with first class standing in most courses.

An applicant need not be enrolled as a graduate student at the time of application, but during the tenure of the award, the applicant must be registered as a full-time student in a graduate program leading to a Master's or Doctoral degree. Students enrolled in a qualifying or 'make-up' year are not eligible to hold an Ontario Graduate Scholarship.
