The following is the report of Provincial Commissioner Amie J. Hutchison: The year just ended has seen the Guide movement in our province progress in a most satisfactory manner. The reports you have heard have shown the work the Commissioners in each different department have been doing and how each one has tried unceasingly to provide the most that is available to our Brownies and Guides in this broad program. There have been no official visitors to Prince Edward Island this past year, but a number of our Guides and Commissioners had the opportunity of meeting the Canadian Commissioner for Training and two of her committee members at the Atlantic Conference in September.

What started out as a Maritime Conference has grown to include New Foundland and is now the Atlantic Conference. With the largest attendance since its beginning, the meetings were held in Halifax last September. A training conference was conducted at the same time; the general feeling is to have more trainings at the time of the biennial Atlantic Conference. The reports that have been presented are all adequate and need no further comment. I feel that these Commissioners and their committees have your full approval and thanks for the work they are doing.

As the annual reports came to me from all over the province I had a feeling of satisfaction as the numbers of Guides and Brownies in all divisions show a marked increase—over ten percent greater population than last year. Girl Guiding is continuing to make itself known in the community with the number and variety of good turns done. The Brownies and Guides cooperated well at both our Raisin and Cookie Days. Perhaps if our Guides and Commissioners could explain more fully to the girls that the money raised at these times is being used for their benefit—training of their leaders, for camp help, both here and internationally and for everything the Guides are interested in doing and learning—then our girls would have even more enthusiasm for these days.

DUTY TO GOD

Without a doubt, the greatest satisfaction in the whole year's work is the fact that we have seventy-five Guides throughout the province now working on their Religion and Life Emblem. This is one of the most important parts of our program as we remember the Guide promise of the first part—"Duty to God." I trust that in the coming year all leaders will stress more fully and encourage more Guides to work for the greater knowledge of their God as taught in their own church and as laid down in the requirements for this award by each church.

In order that the standard of Guiding may be kept high, we feel that each Guide should be rechecked as to her knowledge and spirit before she receives her first class badge. A first class Guide should be a first class girl and one who is a credit to the world-wide organization. Mrs. F. S. Jenkins has agreed to do this for us and we know her recommendation will mean much to the Guide and to those of us who see the first class badge on a Guide uniform.

Several members of the executive and of the council have found it necessary to resign from their places—to them a very hearty "thank you" for your work and co-operation in the past. We know that your interest will continue even though your work will not be so active. To the new members of the executive and of the council we extend a welcome to an organization where your efforts are in usefulness to our most important people—our youth.

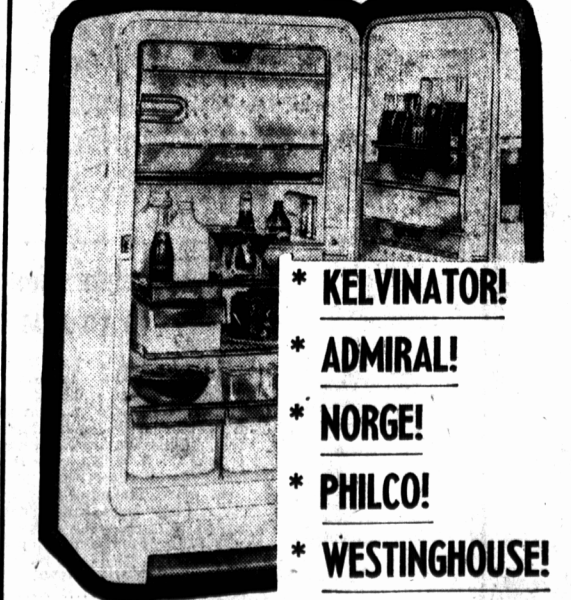

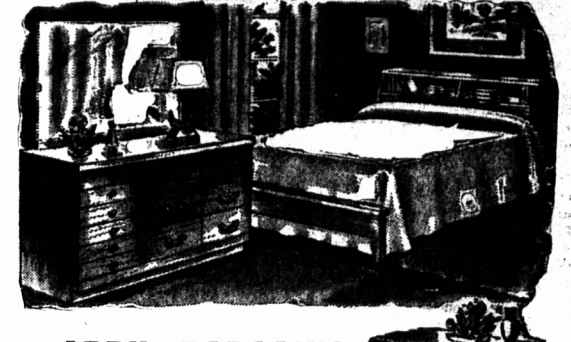
