A STATESMAN'S WORK.
(Montreal Gazette.)

The Moncton Transcript finds that the only suspicious feature about the Pacific cable resolution introduced by the Laurier Government is that it met Tupper's approval.

It is the spirit of this sneer that a great deal of what passes for Liberal criticism of the Conservative leader is conceived; and it is not creditable to Conservatives that some of them seem to allow their views of one of the ablest men Canada's public life has produced to be affected by the jibes or slanders of the meanest newspaper press in North America. In this Pacific cable matter Sir Charles Tupper acted in keeping with his record. He was directly concerned in the inception of the scheme and helped it in its start, and though the fortunes of politics put the duty of adding the final stages in other hands, he was ready to second and approve of the process. He was simply consistent with his record, as a worker for the country's great interests. That has been his role from the first. Were it not for him Nova Scotia might have acted the same part in the Confederation project as Newfoundland and detracted from the completeness of the Dominion. He supported the addition of the Northwest Territories to the area of the original provinces, and was mainly instrumental in securing the assent of Parliament to the scheme which connected the Pacific with the Atlantic coast and made the union commercial and sentimental as well as political. He is a caudex. It was the most rational thing in the world that the Pacific cable scheme, being an extension of the projects he had fathered, should receive his support. Such support to most people will be an added reason for holding the cable scheme to be a good one. But it is not only in regard to the Pacific cable that Sir Charles Tupper has approved the Government's policy. Only the other day the Premier was glad to read in Parliament a letter from him supporting the resolution in regard to the Transvaal Republic, which the Liberal Government thought it wise to have adopted. And only a few days before that again Sir Charles Tupper had put himself on record in regard to the Alaskan boundary dispute in a way that showed both Great Britain and the United States that in maintaining Canada's contentions the Government was seeking for the Canadian people, and had their undivided support. There are on the record things that make it doubtful, had the position of parties been reversed, if Sir Wilfrid Laurier could have done as much. Such sneers as the Transcript's are the outcome of the fact that Sir Charles Tupper is too broad a man to be measured by the ordinary partisan's tape. The events of the present session have helped a great many, and a great many outside of the ranks of his political supporters, to realize this.

AUTHOR OF DAVID HARUM.

A sympathetic sketch of the late Edward Noyes Wescott, is contributed to the August number of the "The National Magazine" by Maitland Leroy Osborne. He says in part:

"The house is closed, and a sign in the window announces that it is for sale. As I went up the pathway, which the author had so often trod, a feeling of sadness crept upon me at the thought that the place was soon to pass into alien hands.

And again in writing of the time that elapsed between the completion of "David Harum" and its acceptance by the publishers:

Under the pathetic conditions of its being it had grown to be a part of his life. Confined now to his bed, utterly helpless, realizing at last that he was never again to rise—each rebuff that the child of his brain received fell with crushing force on the author, sapping his little remaining store of life at an alarming rate. As the conviction slowly grew on him that his long months of weary toil were wasted, that the thing he had wrought with the last remaining strength of heart and brain was not the fair creation he had thought it, his despair became pitiable."

The Peace Conference


St. PETERSBURG, Aug 5.—The official messenger yesterday publishes a government communique reviewing lengthily the result of the Hague peace conference. After referring to the sympathetic reception the powers accorded the czar's magnanimous appeal for peace, it proceeds:—

"The results of the conference have fully come up to the expectations of the government. It has been found necessary for the conference to postpone a definite settlement of the complicated question of the suspension of armaments until fully elucidated by the different governments. Nevertheless the lightening of military burdens is already admitted by unanimous resolutions. On the other hand the labors of the conference will doubtless exercise influence in regulating the customs of war and stopping cruelties. The various states have agreed to use all their resources in favor of the maintenance of peace and the abolition of war. It is now an established fact that mediation, which has hitherto depended on the good will of the states interested, can henceforward be offered by a third power on its own initiative.

The Communique concluding: "Without impairing the sovereign rights of the individual states, the results afford a fresh basis for international peace. The necessity for a solution of the czar's proposal is admitted by all the powers, and the march of events will indicate the means to be employed in securing the welfare of mankind and the full attainment of the objects in view.
