TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

Bismarck on Canal Shares. Operations Against Tunis. Jealousy of the Regiments. Special Dispatch to the Examiner. LONDON, Oct. 11. It is stated here that Bismarck believes that England in order to secure majority of the Suez Canal shares, in order to avoid any conflict with the French holders, or with De Less's strength of the Egyptians will be ten thousand men. Strong reinforcements will be sent to southern Tunis, to operate on a large scale against the insurgents there as soon as the cold season sets in. The water supply at Suex has been restored. Other regiments in the Egyptian Campaign with Wolseley, express great dissatisfaction at the General singling out the Royal Irish for special mention at the battle of Tel-el-Kebir. The report of the Egyptian wheat crop is very favourable.

SAFE! A SEIZURE. EXCITING MAIL ROBBERY

Special to the Examiner. MONTREAL, Oct. 10. The steamer "Neptune" has landed at St. John, N. F., the passengers and baggage of the "Heider," wrecked at Cape Race. The machinery of the Montreal Abattoir Company, valued at one hundred thousand dollars, has been seized by the customs for entering on an under-valuation. Great excitement is caused here over the arrest of Pierre Rotlot, a clerk in the Post Office for twelve years, a brother of Dr. Rotlot one of the best known French physicians in Montreal. Rotlot was arrested for plundering the mails of between \$4000 and \$5000.

LONDON, Oct. 10. Tenders were opened to-day at the Bank of England for £2,000,000 worth of Indian four per cent. debentures. The loan was covered twice at about par. ROME, Oct. 10. Mr. Earington who has been reported to be engaged in endeavoring to effect a *modus vivendi*, between Great Britain and the Vatican, has arrived here. He had an interview with Cardinal Jacobini, Pontifical Secretary of State, yesterday. BERLIN, Oct. 10. William, youngest son of Bismarck, has been raised to the rank of Government Councillor. CHICAGO, Oct. 10. Through the negligence of an inspector who failed to vaccinate persons on east North Avenue where a sporadic case of small pox recently appeared, the disease has broken out in seven adjacent houses. Wholesale vaccination is now progressing in that section and no fears are entertained of the further spread of the disease. CAPE RACE, Nfld., Oct. 10. The steamer "Neptune" passed here at 3.15 bound for St. John's, with the passengers and crew of the wrecked Steamer "Heider." She will arrive at St. John's about midnight. The ship has been given to salvors who have already removed considerable cargo. ELPASO, Ill., Oct. 10. A fire here, this afternoon, burned an entire block of wooden buildings, including the Elpaso Hotel and 14 business houses. Loss \$100,000.
