Air Rate War Seen Shaping

MONTREAL (CP)—A spokesman for Scandinavian Airlines System indicated Monday that a rate war may be in the making on North Atlantic air routes.

He said in an interview that the SAS deficit of \$7,000,000 in 1981 was entirely due to competition from Icelandic Airlines on flights between North America and Copenhagen.

SAS files daily New York Copenhagen jet flights on rates set by the airlines-regulating International Air Transport Association, of which SAS is a member. The spokesman said Iceland, a non-member, undercuts SAS return fares by \$100 in summer and \$140 in winter. "We tried to reach some agreement with Icelandic," said the SAS spokesman. "We suggested a merger of a non-

service, but they haven't agreed."

REFUSED FARE CUT

Delegates to an IATA traffic conference in October asked permission to apply rates that would keep pace with Icelandic. IATA, whose 92 member airlines agree on rates for world air routes, refused.

New rates, which include a five-per-cent increase on international return fares, go into effect next April 1 for two years. SAS warned it would veto the IATA decision on the North Atlantic if no solution could be found in 45 days from the end of the conference Oct. 31.

Social Credit Would Lease Vacant Office

OTTAWA (CP)—The Social Credit party is looking for a tenant to take over the lease on its \$625-a-month offices here. National Leader Robert Thompson said Monday that staff of the national office was moved out of the rented quarters because of a decision after the June 18 election to cut down expenses.

Sam Berger, whose O'Connor Realities owns the building, said the Social Credit party left about two weeks ago "without giving us any notice and without paying the rent they owed." Mr. Thompson said it is true the party moved to new temporary quarters and that the party owes two months' rent but "there isn't the slightest question O'Connor Realities will get their money."

India Asks For Clothing From Canada

OTTAWA (CP)—India has asked Canada for various types of clothing for use in the Himalayas, Prime Minister Diefenbaker told the Commons Monday.

But he added that he has had no personal notice of any Indian request for artillery equipment and long-range mortars. Mr. Diefenbaker was replying to Opposition Leader Pearson, who referred to reports of requests for winter clothing and the artillery. Mr. Pearson said the reports said Canada informed India that no long-range mortars were available.

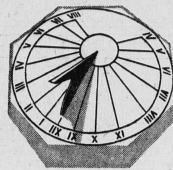
