

## Blustering Snow Storm Moves Away Into Atlantic

A blustering snow storm moved away into the Atlantic south of Newfoundland Wednesday after clogging the Maritime snowflurries fell in New

times and Quebec with snow earlier this week.  
Strong winds and mild temperatures continued throughout most of the Maritimes and a few snowflurries fell in New

Brunswick and Nova Scotia.  
The numbing New Year's cold snap ended in much of Canada but gales and rain spread rapidly over the British Columbia coast ahead of a Pacific storm.  
The rain was expected to spread to the interior of British Columbia today.  
MILD IN ALBERTA  
Temperatures were mild in southern Alberta Wednesday with Calgary recording 35, Lethbridge 47, and Medicine Hat 42. In the northern section

of the province Edmonton had 15 degrees and Peace River was zero.  
The Northwest and Yukon territories recorded bone-chilling temperatures as low as 42 below zero.  
Skies were clear and temperatures lower in much of Saskatchewan. Regina was 11 degrees and Saskatoon nine.  
The clear weather continued into Manitoba and Winnipeg reached a high of 32 degrees

with five degrees forecast for this morning.  
Northern Ontario had occasionally mild temperatures of 20 to 25 degrees and southern and central Ontario were also mild.  
The milder weather is expected to continue in most of Ontario today.  
Sunny intervals are forecast for Quebec, still digging out from a heavy Monday snowfall that cut communications and stranded motorists.

### 9 Cruise Ships Head For N.Y.

NEW YORK (AP)—Nine Ships with thousands of Caribbean cruise passengers headed into New York harbor Wednesday in the midst of resumed picketing in the United States longshoremen's strike which struck Atlantic and gulf ports 11 days ago.  
The Grace liner Santa Lucia disembarked 30 passengers

across the New York harbor at Hoboken, N.J.  
LINERS MANOEUVRE  
The liners Queen Mary and France had difficulty in docking at their Manhattan berths because of icy conditions.  
The French liner, winding up a cruise with 910 passengers, took 2½ hours to get close enough to Pier 88 to fasten a gangplank. The Cunard's Queen Mary, arriving from English Channel ports with 682 passengers, had less trouble in dock-

ing at Pier 90. Both liners were aided by tugs.  
Dockworkers said prior to the walkout they would allow entering ships to disembark passengers and would refrain from action that would block tugboat assistance to arriving ships.  
The Furness liner Ocean Monarch, from Bermuda and Nassau, docked with 353 passengers.
