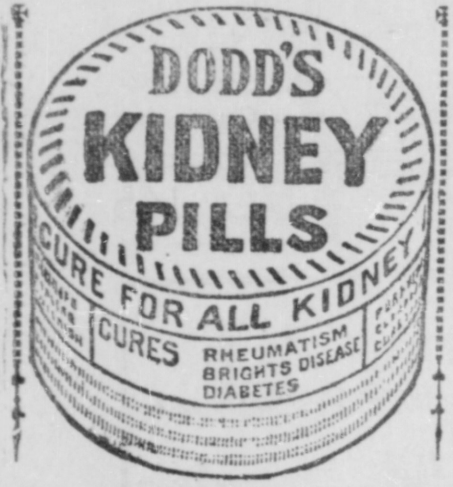

CHAINED LIKE DOGS.

Mother Ties up Her Sons to Keep Them Out of Mischief.

FALL RIVER, Mass., June 19.—Chained to a dry goods box, like snapping dogs, two little boys were discovered by workmen in a room in a tenement house, No. 153 Flint street, in the squalid district tenanted by mill hands.

Mrs. Mary La Douceur is the mother of three children, a girl of eight years, a boy of five. Her husband left the city some time ago. The mother works in the Wampanog mill and during the day has kept the boys chained up.

Both boys, day by day, have been fastened to a rough box. A padlock, the key of which the mother keeps, prevents them from escaping. The little girl is allowed to go out doors and play, but the two boys are always confined in doors and they crawl about the floor in and out of the box like captive dogs. Their food has been left nearby.

When an officer entered the room the oldest boy had just been released from his chain, and he ran and clung to him in a manner that excited pity. The other little chap made no demonstration, but appeared exceedingly happy when released. Both boys were examined and marks were seen on their legs showing the pressure.

The mother said it was with no cruel intention that she chained the boys up, but only to keep them out of mischief and danger.

Officers told her what a serious thing it would be if a fire started in the tenement with little boys chained and unable even to approach the windows. She replied that if danger confronted the children they could easily have pulled out the staples from the box and released themselves.

An officer tried to extract the staples and found it required more than the strength of an ordinary man to do so.

The women promised to get a house-keeper to care for her children. Mrs. La Douceur last evening packed her effects and taking her children went to the mill town of Warren, R. I., ten miles from here.

To Cross the Atlantic.

GLoucester, Mass., June 19.—Under the escort of the Gloucester yacht club and a fleet of nearly 100 yachts, Howard Blackburn of this city set sail this afternoon in his little sloop rigged four ton boat, the Great Western, on a trip across the Atlantic. Blackburn is a native of Nova Scotia. He has stored provisions for a ninety days' trip. Gloucester, Eng., is the first point where he expects to land. He will visit the principal European cities, including Paris during the exposition.

To Raise a Century Fund.

HAMILTON, Ont., June 17.—The Presbyterian General Assembly have decided to raise a 20th century fund of one million dollars. Practically the whole of the afternoon sermon was given to the question, and of many speakers, representing all sections of the Church, not one raised a dissenting voice, while nearly all regarded the undertaking enthusiastically as a great enterprise worthy of Presbyterianism and bound to redound to the material advancement and spiritual uplifting of the Church.

Macedonian Volcano.

BELGRAVE, June 17.—Serious conflicts are reported to have occurred on the Turkish frontier. According to the advices received, the Servian post at Propachitza has been plundered and burned and several strategic positions are occupied by the Turkish and Albanians. Great excitement prevails here.

BERESFORD SEES DANGER.

Strong Letter on the Scarcity of British Seamen.

LONDON, June 19.—Lord Charles Beresford has received a communication concerning the dearth of British seamen, and drawing his attention to the reply given by the President of the Board of Trade to the deputation of the Navy League that a scheme of training lads at the expense of the government was one he positively declined to put before the House of Commons, and his assertion that if the mercantile marine wanted British seamen they should train them at their own expense. In his reply Lord Charles Beresford says he is not surprised at the attitude of Mr. Ritchie. The attitude of authority always has been to ignore great questions such as these mentioned till the press and the public force their attention upon such matters and insist upon something being done. Lord Charles adds:

The dearth of British seamen and the fact that their ranks will have to be depleted in war time by taking away their finest specimens for the Royal Naval reserve, constitute, in my opinion, a serious danger to the maritime interests of the country, and problems of food supply and freight of raw materials and other merchandise are very much hampered by this danger. I am distinctly of opinion that it is the duty of the Government to take up these questions and endeavor to find a solution for the difficulty, and that the best way of inducing them to do this is to agitate and place all facts before the public and persist in advertising our dangerous position until the press and the public insist on some remedy being found. It is better for the nation to be made aware of serious dangers in time of peace even at the risk of informing foreign governments too much about our necessities and weak points than it is to allow them to discover these weak points in time of war, when it is too late to apply a remedy."

New Forts to Defend Tokio.

Moscow, June 17.—According to despatches from Tokio, Japan is about to enlarge and strengthen the fortifications of that city. It has already been determined that three new forts shall be built to command Tokio Bay.

The Prohibition Removed.

WASHINGTON, June 18.—Special-Plenipotentiary Kasson has just received authenticated copy from Belgium of the decree recently enacted by the Belgian government, raising the prohibition of the importation into Belgium of American cattle.

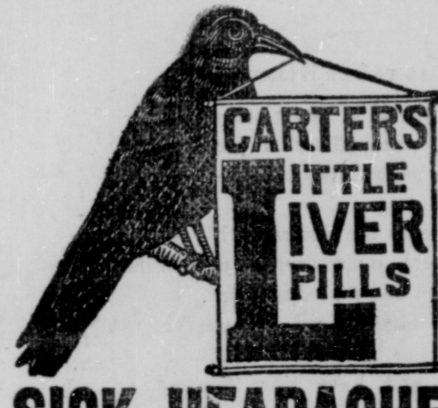

Purse for Fitzsimmons and McCoy.

CHICAGO, June 17.—The Colorado Athletic Association has offered a \$20,000 purse for a 25 round contest between Bob Fitzsimmons and "Kid" McCoy according to an announcement made here to-day by Ben Benton, McCoy's present manager. The proposed fight is to be for the middle-weight championship of the world. McCoy to-day wired his acceptance saying he would fight at 158 pounds or at catch weights on any day. In case Fitz accepts the Denver contingent's offer, his match with Joe Choynski will be put off.

Two Missionaries Murdered.

HONG KONG, June 19.—It has developed that the Rev. H. S. Phillips, Mrs. Phillips and Miss Sears, missionaries of the church missionary society, who, with three native converts, were recently killed by rioters in the province of Nigan Hwoi, had sought protection of the Yamen at Kien Yang. The Yamen, not being strong enough to protect them, sent the party under escort to Kien Ning Fu, but the missionaries were murdered on the way there. It is reported that the natives destroyed also the church, parsonage and hospital at Kien Ning Fu.
