the anticipated strength has not developed up to the present time. It is still hoped that the balance of last year's crop may be marketed.

In New Brunswick the portion of last year's crop still un sold is somewhat higher than on the Island. In the opinion of the Island Potato Marketing Board the P.E.I. Potato Growers would be well advised to reduce their plantings as suggested, also to not grow any potatoes for which they do not have adequate fall storage. Some way must and will be found to prevent a repetition of the almost complete collapse of the potato market such as transpired last November.

"For this reason the Island Potato Board, at the request of farm organizations throughout the Province are preparing to register all Island Potato Growers during the months of June and July. By so doing the Island Potato Board feels that it will be in a position to effectively grapple with a similar marketing problem as existed last fall, if it should again arise.

"It is worthy of note that after its first year of operations the New Brunswick Potato Marketing Board is now making plans for next year's operations and that the New Brunswick Government has seen fit at the last session of the New Brunswick legislature to have passed a new Natural Products Control Act which seems to be about the most comprehensive legislation of its kind in any province of Canada and which will undoubtedly be of great assistance to the New Brunswick Potato Marketing Board in carrying out its future operations."

However, he cautioned the Reds were reinforcing their defence screen—rear guard—all along the east-central front.

More powerful screening forces were being rushed south by the Reds to keep the Allies from cutting the main Communist withdrawal route.

This report tallied with air observations of Red vehicles moving by night from Chorwon to Hwachon across the central front and well above the 38th parallel. Other Red vehicles were again streaming southward from the Manchurian border into North-west Korea.

While the powerful armada of tanks and vehicles carried United Nations troops into Red Korea for the third time in the war, Allied units pushed back into Chunchon. It was the seventh time that battered road centre changed hands.
