"The idea for the names came from North Pole Mountain, which was an unofficial local name for one of the hills," Mr. Fraser said.

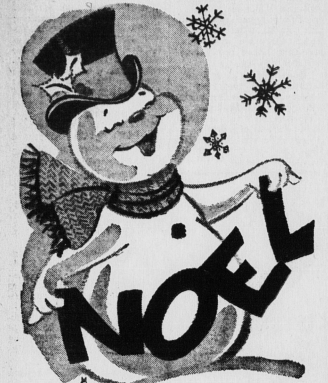
NOT REALLY MOUNTAINS

The mountains are within about 20 miles of each other in the northwest section of the province.

Mr. Fraser said there was a proposal to include a Mount Rudolph, "but it was never seriously considered."

"We figured the other names have been widely accepted in folklore, but Rudolph was too new and too commercial."

EXPERT QUILTS RAIL POST
LONDON (Reuters) — Dr. Richard Reeching, a top business executive switched from industry to modernize Britain's near-bankrupt state-owned railway, is to give up his post in the middle of next year. Reeching, appointed by the former Conservative government at a record civil service salary of about \$2,000 a year, will go back to the giant Imperial Chemical Industries.

VANCOUVER (CP) — Canadian Plywood Corporation Ltd. of Vancouver plans to build a \$3,000,000 plywood plant with grass-roots capital.

It is raising money by selling shares to the men who will someday work there.

The sale of shares started a few months ago. So far, sales to workers have amounted to \$50,000.

Robert Flini, a director of the company, says the price of shares is high, the return of sales is slow, but the investment will be solid.
