Gaudet was about 45 years of age, and leaves a wife and ten children to mourn. The lightning struck the clock on the mantel and knocked it down, breaking one of the hands. The barn and out-buildings of a Mr. Arling at Freetown were struck by lightning and burned to the ground. Everything stored in the buildings was destroyed.
