Had he done so, declarer probably would have finished against West's ten on the next heart lead. Nevertheless, South still should have made the contract although East ducked on the first round. East had shown two spades, two clubs and must have held seven diamonds, since otherwise West, with four or more dia-

monds, would have opened fourth-highest instead of the ten-spot. Thus, East was marked with an original holding of only two hearts, and, after the queen held the first heart trick, South should have played low to his own ace.
