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Mr. MacLeod was born at Valleyfield, East, P.E.I. on December 15, 1891. He was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Jonathan MacLeod.

He received his early education at Valleyfield and as a very young man came to Charlottetown. Business College where he received the Maclellan Gold Medal in 1910. The same year he joined the staff of Bruce Stewart and Company of Agriculture.

In March 1915 he went overseas with the 2nd Siege Battery. During his service overseas he was a member of the 26th battalion and the 4th Canadian Howitzer Battery until he was demobilized at the end of the war.

In 1919 he was appointed accountant with the Prohibition Commission and later that year he was with the Vendor, which position he held until his retirement in 1948. On September 15, 1948 he was married Marion Edith Crockett of Charlottetown.

He was a faithful member of Zion Presbyterian Church having taught Sunday School there for many years and served on the Board of Trustees. His patience and hospitality won the respect of all who knew him.

His wife, his sorrowing widow, he leaves to mourn one daughter Alice Catherine (Mrs. Murray) and one son, Donald A. MacLeod, Charlottetown.

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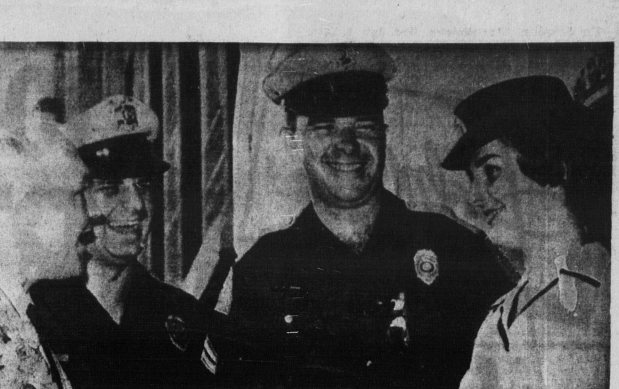
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
