WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY.

Some Successful Experiments Made In England.

LONDON, Mar. 8.—Great interest was excited at a meeting of the Society of Electric Engineers on Thursday night by Signor Marconi's wireless telegraphy demonstration. He sent a message from one end of the hall to the other on a small apparatus, and said that operations, in progress daily for months between South Foreland and the Lightship at the East Goodwins, showed that on no single occasion had communication been interrupted despite all sorts of bad weather. Messages between the Queen at Osborne and the Prince of Wales on the Royal yacht have been in some instances transmitted eight miles over land intervening. During the lecture Marconi received a note conveying the permission of the French government to establish his system between Folkestone and Boulogne. Marconi states that a vertical wire rising to a height of 114 feet will be sufficient to ensure communication between the two coasts.
