

Juniors Take Over Courts In Can. Badminton Ch'ships

MONTREAL (CP) — The juniors, 18 and under, took over the courts Wednesday at the Canadian Badminton Championships and British Columbia produced a fine showing.

Semi-finals are set for today, the third day of the four-day tournament that has drawn some 125 competitors.

Ed Peterson and Bruce Rollick, a couple of sturdy-built kids from Vancouver, raved through the boys quarter-finals while Victoria's Judy Humber and Alison DaySmith advanced among the girls.

A third girl from Victoria, Diana Godfrey, combined with a partner from the east coast, Judy Shakespeare of Halifax, to stay in the running for the girls doubles title after being beaten in the singles.

Peterson is pitted against German-born Eric Persch from Windsor, Ont., while Rollick goes against Gordon Wade of Niagara Falls, Ont.

Miss Humber meets Rev Chittick of Windsor, Ont., and Miss DaySmith plays Winnipeg's Mari Stubbs.

In quarter-final play, Peterson trounced Cam Dalgleish of Calgary 15-1, 15-4 and Rollick outlasted Sam McCallum of Niagara Falls, Ont., 15-7, 15-18, 17-14.

Sue Carr Harris of Oakville, Ont., bowed 11-1, 11-5 to petite Miss Humber, Miss DaySmith eliminated Helen Cayrak of Creighton Mines, Ont., 11-4, 11-1.

Miss Godfrey, meanwhile, went down 4-11, 11-4, 11-5 to Miss Stubbs and Miss Chittick defeated Eleanor O'Gorman of Winnipeg, 11-6, 11-5.

Wade beat Geoff Ursell 15-4, 15-2 and Persch shaded Doug Hughes 18-16, 15-12. Both losers are from Winnipeg.

In the doubles Peterson and Rollick clash with Persch and Tim Smith of Toronto and Gordon Grant and his twin brother Graham from Toronto meet Wade and McCallum.

The draw sends Humber-DaySmith against Miss Chittick and Bonnie Elmstey of Peterborough, Ont., and Godfrey-Shakespeare against Stubbs-O'Gorman.

'Kid' Paret Maintaining Improvement

NEW YORK (AP) — Boxer Benny (Kid) Paret "is maintaining the slight improvement which he showed Tuesday," a medical bulletin issued by Roosevelt Hospital said late Wednesday.

The bulletin added the condition of the fighter, shown of the world welterweight title and beaten senseless in 12 rounds by Emile Griffith at Madison Square Garden last Saturday, "remains critical."

The 25-year-old Cuban-born Paret has been in a coma since the fight.

Earlier, the hospital reported Paret had made "some purposeful movements" with his arms, and that his coma had lessened.

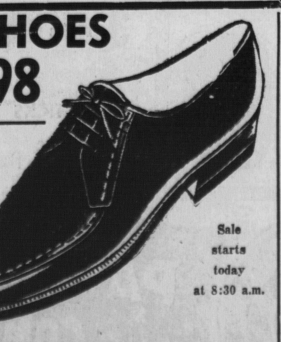
