IN MEMORIAM

MR. FRANK MACNEILL

The death occurred at his home in Cardigan, on April 20, of Mr. Frank MacNeill, in his 83rd year. The deceased was in failing health for a number of years and was tenderly cared for by his wife.

The late Mr. MacNeill, son of Mr. and Mrs. Josiah MacNeill, was born in New Perh. Early in life he learned the cheese and butter making trade which he followed for many years until he retired in 1932. Since then he had been on the farm with his son, Lynwood. For a number of years he had been secretary of the Cardigan Electric Light Company. He was a faithful member of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church and in his younger years was very active in Church work, having been Sunday School Superintendent for many years and a leader in Christian Endeavour. He was a man of sterling worth, honest and upright in character, a man whose word was never questioned. He was a fine citizen and his passing will leave a vacancy in home and community which will be hard to fill.

Last September all the family were at home and celebrated the 50th wedding anniversary of Mr. and Mrs. MacNeill, an occasion which Mr. MacNeill, although in ill health, greatly enjoyed. He leaves to mourn besides his sorrowing widow, (nee Jane Buchanan), two sons (Harvey of Cambridge, Mass., and Lynwood at home, and one daughter, Florence, (Mrs. Melvin Becker), of Ayr, Ontario; also three sisters (Mrs. John MacKinnon), Brookline, Mass., Cora, (Mrs. Will Revel), Woburn, Mass., and Margaret (Mrs. Arthur Smith) Brookline, Mass. Nine grandchildren and one great grand child also survive. Two sons and two daughters predeceased him a number of years ago. His sister, Mrs. MacKinnon, son Harvey and daughter, Florence, were home for the funeral. Truly it may be said of the deceased that earth's loss is Heaven's gain.

The funeral, which was largely attended, was held Sunday afternoon from his late residence. Rev. F. N. Young, pastor of the church, officiated. The hymns sung were 'The Shepherd's Psalm' and 'Asleep in Jesus.' A solo 'O Love That Will Not Let Me Go' was tenderly sung by Rev. Mr. Young. Interment was in the Church Cemetery, where the remains of a loving husband and father were committed to the keeping of Mother Earth until the day break and the shadows were fled away. The pallbearers were Oswald Collins, H. M. Brothers, Gerald MacDonald, Gordon Roberts, Henry Craswell and Earl MacDonald. His weary hours and days of pain, His troubled nights are passed; And in our aching hearts we know He has found sweet rest at last.
