

# Vocational Institute Has Cornerstone Laid

Premier Walter R. Shaw, just returned from a tour of the cornerstone for the new Provincial Vocational Institute at special ceremonies at the school last night.

In making an address at the official opening ceremonies in the large new auditorium, Premier Shaw said it was an inspiration to look through the new school and see what the province is doing for its people.

The premier said he was proud of this school and the one at Summerside and felt they "filled a great void in educational attainments in the province".

He said that before these training schools were built, young people became lost and were unable to cope with the world of competition because they were not trained in the crafts and sciences.

Several officials of vocational schools in other provinces were in attendance at the opening and were introduced as guests on the platform by W.S. MacLellan.

Chairman of the ceremonies was Provincial Education Minister Dr. L.G. Dewar who welcomed the guests.

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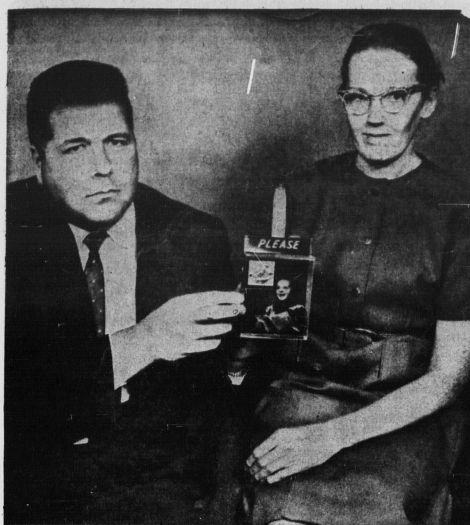

## 7th-Day Adventists Launch Annual Appeal

The 60th Annual World Missions Appeal, sponsored by the Charlottetown Seventh-day Adventist church, opens today with home-to-home canvases accompanied by Christmas caroling.

Leading the volunteer workers participating in the four-week city-wide drive is Clifton L. Davis, pastor of the church. The goal here is \$125.

Funds will go toward extending welfare, disaster aid, and educational services at home as well as a widespread medical, welfare, and educational ministry in 155 other countries.

The local church operates a welfare centre at 20 Laphorne Avenue. Persons in need of assistance or knowing others needing material aid need only to phone.

On a world basis volunteer Adventist workers in 1962 gave 8,253,649 hours in welfare services to 7,224,068 persons. More than \$1,851,286 in cash, some \$726,109 articles of clothing, and 4,829,101 food baskets were contributed.

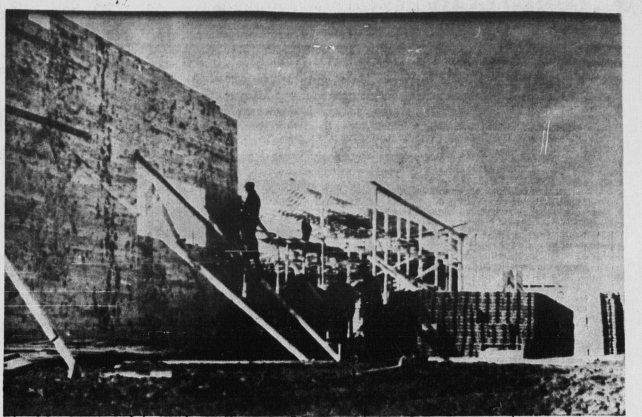
Expected and milder weather is shown Sunday as the disturbance passes north of the Maritimes.

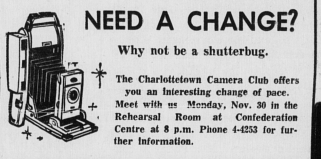
