U. S. Steel Report

CLEVELAND, (AP)—Steel ingot production rose last week for the first time since Feb. 21, climbing one point to 69 per cent of capacity. Steel magazine reports.
 The new rate is the highest since the week ended March 7. "Not all districts made increases, but some showed sharp enough improvements to slightly more than offset declines in others," the magazine's weekly report said.

Points showing gains were Youngstown 4 points to 70 per cent; New England 8 to 65, St. Louis 10 to 62 and Chicago 0.5 to 77. Declines reported were Wheeling 2.5 to 75.5, Pittsburgh 1 to 73 and Buffalo 2.5 to 67.5.

Steel also noted a survey taken by Solar Steel Corp., a nationwide steel warehouse firm, forecasting a further increase in steel production.

The firm's report predicted steel purchases by the metalworking industry will increase 36 per cent above the February level by May 15. The report was based on information obtained from 240 steel consuming companies.

New York Stocks

NEW YORK, (AP)—In its strongest advance in well over a year, the stock market last week pushed ahead to new peaks.

Volume hit a daily average of 2,157,000 shares, the greatest daily average for business since Easter week of last year.

The rally really started at the end of the week before last, and it carried through in a moderate manner Monday and Tuesday on mounting volume. Aircrafts were quite strong on those two days.

Wednesday, the day President Eisenhower signed the bill cutting excise taxes, the stock market set rolling. Aircrafts continued their strength, but they faltered when the lure of profits brought on selling.

Railroads then came to life and took the role of leader. There was an immediate rush to buy everything but the tired aircrafts.

The session ended with the best average gain of the year on the heaviest volume of the year.

Those who expected the market to drop back Thursday were fooled. Aircrafts continued to back and fill, but leadership revolved through several key divisions.

Friday's market held to the best gains of the week with tenacity and declined only slightly on average.

The five most active issues on the New York stock exchange were: RKO Pictures up 1-8 at 6 on 388,100 shares; Glen Martin up 3-14 at 24 1-4; Curtiss-Wright up 3-8 at 10 1-4; Fairchild-Engine up 1 at 13 1-4, and U. S. Steel up 1 3-4 at 43.

Canadian stocks closed the week mixed. Canadian Pacific, International Nickel and McIntyre each fell 3-8. Dome Mines, Hiram Walker and Distillers Seagram were each ahead 1-8.

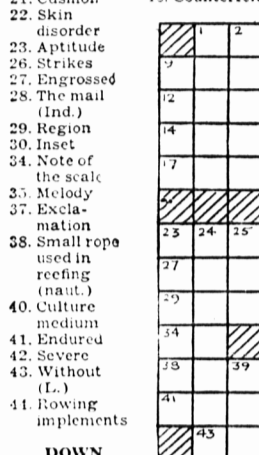
TORONTO, (CP)—Robert H. Saunders, Ontario hydro chairman, said Friday construction of the St. Lawrence river power project can
