JOHN FABIAN MACKINNON

The usual pleasant visit of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Campbell friends at the hospitable home of John F. MacKinnon, Goose River, was suddenly and sadly terminated on the evening of July 13th, when while assisting his father-in-law, who is an invalid, to his car, Mr. MacKinnon suddenly passed away. Although suffering from a heart condition for some time he was in no way confined in his activities, with the exception of no heavy manual labour, and was apparently giving no indication that the end was so near.

He was widely known throughout eastern Kings and was always a general favorite with young and old and at any gathering he was the centre of amusement for his witticisms and abundance of folklore. Now the prominent figure of "Jack Stepher" as he was known by to his many friends will for many years be sadly missed whenever any members of the parish foregather.

He was 67 years old and is survived by his widow the former Mary C. MacAdam of Canavoy, and one sister, Mrs. Mary MacKinnon of Manchester, Mass. His funeral was held at St. Peter's Church, St. Peter's, on July 16th, and despite the inclemency of the weather friends from near and far came to pay their final respects to a good neighbor and friend. High Mass of Requiem was sung by his pastor, Rev. W. V. MacDonald, who also officiated at the grave. Seated in the sanctuary was Rev. George McDonald, St. Margarets. The pall bearers were Joseph Wilson, Peter MacKinnon, Harold MacKinnon, Elmer Sutherland, Alexander MacAdam and Hugh MacIsaac. To his widow and sister we extend our deepest sympathy. May his soul rest in peace.

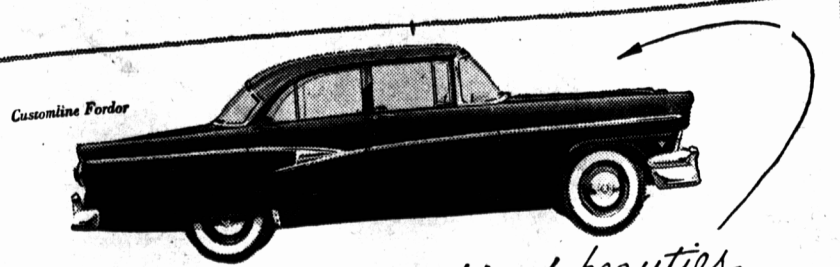

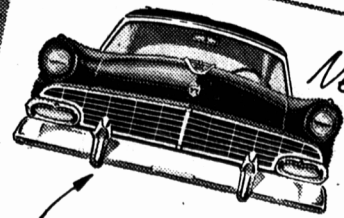

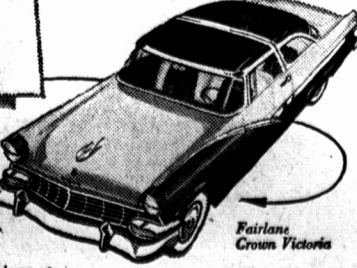
