MONTREAL (CP) — Defenceman Tom Johnson of Montreal Canadiens suffered a left shoulder separation in Thursday night's National Hockey League game against New York Rangers, examinations confirmed Friday.

Johnson definitely will be out of the coming weekend games and may possibly be lost to the club for as long as two weeks. Defenceman Albert Langlois is recovering from an ankle injury, suffered when struck by a puck during a game in Toronto Wednesday. Langlois was dressed for Thursday night's game but the injury was too painful to permit him to play. He is expected to play against Chicago Black Hawks here today.

to the owner, driver and horse that has been doped. These penalties are very severe.

The Supreme Court of Canada had a peculiar case to handle recently. It was an appeal by William Morrissey, a Toronto breeder and owner, against a Commission order in May, 1957, that the names of six of his horses be changed. The horses were named: Hot Ice, Stole The Ring, Red-Nosed Clown, Rabbit Mouth, Irene's Orphan, and Into The Grave. The Commission contended that these names were chosen to cast ridicule on Fred Orpen, retired owner of the old Long Branch track near Toronto, with whom Morrissey had a dispute in 1946. If the names were not changed by a certain time, the Commission had indicated, the horses would be barred from racing on Ontario tracks, and consequently, elsewhere in Canada and the United States.

The horses have continued to race at various meets during the court's proceedings, which began in June, 1957.

**NEW OCCUPANT**  
The Don Seaman Stable has a new occupant at the Charlotte-town track in the four-year-old bay filly, Crafty Belle, by Anti-Aircraft, dam Belle Morris, by Calumet Ebilis 2.014, dam Miss Abbey Morris, by Guy Abbe 2.064 second dam, The Great Miss Morris, 2.074, by Peter The Great 2.074.

Belle Morris was bred at the Leo C. MacNamara Farm in Indianapolis, Indiana.

Anti-Aircraft will be remembered by Maritimers for his stirring performances over local tracks. He had a record of 2.03 on a mile track. We looked back to Old Home Week in 1946, and on the afternoon of August 16 in the free-for-all Pace, purse \$1,000, raced before a tremendous crowd of spectators. Wilkin won

the first heat in 2.09, with Anti-Aircraft, second. An. A. Craft won next two in 2.074 and 2.10. He was then owned by Charles H. Horton, Murray River, P.E.I. Anti-Aircraft also campaigned in Sydney that year where he had three heat wins in three starts. At Moncton he had two wins in three starts, at Amherst three wins in three starts, in New Glasgow three wins in three starts (one of them in 2.074), and at Old Home Week in Charlotte-town he made three starts and won twice with the fastest mile in 2.074. Later, at St. Stephen, he made three starts and won once in 2.08, losing the two others to Pine Ridge Alex. In his 18 winning starts and other placings he amassed total winnings that year of more than \$5,000, racing only in the Maritimes.

In the U.S.A. yearbook for 1958, we notice that he is the sire of Sally Aircraft, 4. 2.05 4-5; Teddy Aircraft 2.05 2-5; Mickey Aircraft 2.07 1-5, and several others. His owner last year was reported to be John A. Seymour, DeKalb Junction, New York.

**CLOSING PROGRAM**  
Rockingham track, New Hampshire, held its closing program on the night of November 28th, under not too favorable conditions. see him end the season's racing by winning such a nice, fat purse. Mr. Saunders made a flying visit to Charlottetown this week, and received a warm greeting from his many friends in this area.

The Maritimes had another place winner on the above program, with Licking Time picking up a third place in 2.16 2-5 on the muddy track. He is owned by Heber Sweeney, Bridgewater, N.S.
