## EXCITING CHASE FOR YOUNG GIRL HEIRESS

CHICAGO, Nov. 27.—Deputy sheriffs in automobiles raced about Chicago yesterday in search of a seven year old girl heiress and her father, who was custody the child was given yesterday by a circuit court judge. Their efforts were futile however, and the fleeing father and daughter are thought to be on their way to the father's home in the east.

The search was for the purpose of gaining possession of Kathryn A. Good, daughter of Henry F. Good of Lock Haven, Pa. The mother of the girl who was divorced from her husband, was killed in an automobile accident near Buffalo, N. Y., in September and the child's grandmother, Mrs. John K. Hoxie of this city, was made guardian of the girl's estate which is valued at about \$400,000.

No sooner had the girl been given into her father's care than the grandmother secured a writ enjoining Good from taking Kathryn out of Illinois. Deputy sheriffs were whisked in automobiles from one hotel and railroad station to another but were finally compelled to admit defeat.

Mrs. Hoxie avers that she was legally appointed guardian of the girl by the probate court and that the father has no legal right to the child.

## GREAT STORM IN FAR WEST

PORTLAND, Oregon, Nov. 27.—The unprecedented storm that has prevailed in the Pacific North-west for two days, shows no signs of abating. In Eastern Washington the rain is of secondary importance to a wind storm, which has caused considerable financial loss. So far as reported no lives have been lost.

No damage to shipping is reported, except the stranding of the schooner Mary Winkleman, near Port Townsend.

In North-western Washington, the ranches on the low lands are flooded, and the railroads have lost a number of bridges. Train schedules are demoralized.

Along the lower Puget Sound the streams are all but of their banks, and flooding the lowlands and destroying bridges, and railroad tracks. The Great Northern railroad which crosses the Cascade east of Everett is tied up, several trains being stalled in the mountains.

In the Grays Harbor country the greatest loss has been to logs, one raft alone, valued at \$200,000, being swept out to the sea.

Along the bank of the Columbia River landslides have put the railroads out of business temporarily.

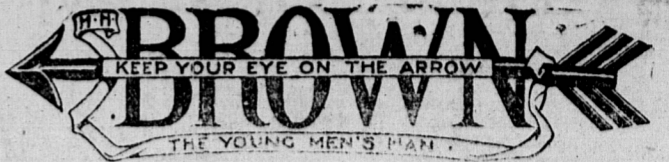
## BIG DECISION IS RENDERED

MONTREAL, Nov. 27.—In the police court yesterday morning Judge Lest rendered a judgment of vast importance to insurance men in Canada. It dismisses a charge of collecting premiums in Montreal for Lloyds, a company that is not licensed to carry on such business here. Judge Lest takes this course by questioning the validity of the Insurance Act itself. He contended "that even if the insurance business could be called one of the trades of the country the Dominion parliament has no power to regulate it in the way the act in question (the Insurance Act) attempts to do."

"It is judgment," says later, "from some points of view it might be for the benefit of Canada to declare that a company could not do business in one province even, without coming under conditions such as are imposed by the act in question, that would not give the Dominion parliament power to make such conditions. The rendering of the judgment is creating the widest comment among business men in general.

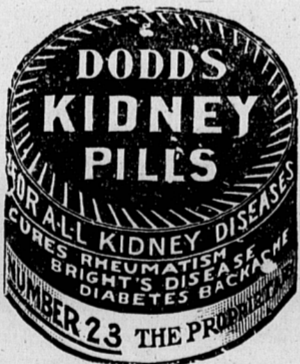

One Free-Trade organ quotes that at the present moment there are 200,000 unemployed in that city. A Tariff Reform paper however, in deriding the contention got a statement from Mr. McGowan, President of the Board of Aldermen, New York, which says "There is no unemployed at the present time in New York."
