OPENING OF THE LOUISBURG RAILWAY.

Pleasant Trip to a Classic Spot.

Monument Erected by the Society of Colonial Wars.

The opening of the Louisburg Railway appeals to public interest in more points than one. It emphasizes the development of the coal mines of our sister Province which is steadily going on in Cape Breton under the progressive management of the Dominion Coal Company.

But to those whose minds have room for other considerations beyond the merely utilitarian, the thought of easy and direct communication with Louisburg opens up a field of exploration and research which promises to give fresh life to one of the most stirring periods in the history of this Continent.

At Louisburg we stand once more amid the years big with fate, when for many a day the issue seemed to hang in the balance whether the France of England or the Lilies of France should float over the New World.

And their good swords rust, yet we cannot but feel a thrill as we stand in the presence of the monument which was erected by the Society of Colonial Wars.

It was therefore with feelings of no little interest that we were invited to accompany the Hon. the Lieutenant-Governor on his trip to Louisburg.

Reaching the quiet town of Pictou we speedily transfer ourselves to the S.S. Egerton and off up the East River for New Glasgow.

Who originated the idea, it is difficult to decide. But to Governor Shirley, of Massachusetts, and to the sons of the Key-Stone State (which then included Maine) belongs most of the glory.

Restored to France by the treaty of Amiens in 1763, it was never more to rise, in 1758, the prowess of British troops and British sea power, commanded by Amherst and Wolfe.
