He is not dead, he has but passed beyond the mists that blind us here into the new and larger life of that serene sphere.

A deep gloom of sorrow entered the homes of the immediate family, as well as friends and neighbours, in Gaspereaux and the surrounding districts on July 23, when they learned of the passing of his eternal rest of William Charles Graham.

Elder son of the late Charles G. Graham and Lillie E. Graham, he was born in Gaspereaux on November 6, 1907, and was a life long resident of that district. On October 28, 1931, he married Lulu Eileen MacLure, daughter of the late George MacLure and Emma Daniel. God blessed this happy union with two children, who with their mother are left to mourn the loss of a kind and beloved husband and father. They are, Lulu, who returned from Toronto because of her father's illness, and Charles at home.

The late Mr. Graham was a successful and industrious farmer until seven years ago at which time he assumed the responsibilities of the spinning factory once operated by his father. By his quiet and unassuming manner, Will, as he was familiarly known, won and retained the confidence of a host of friends. As a young, well-known business man, his sterling character, personality and methods of working were such that the men in his employ loved and respected him, while those with whom he had business relations admired his honesty and fairness.

In his early married life he accepted Christ as his Saviour and became a member of the Murray Harbour North Presbyterian Church. He was a generous supporter of his church, and a faithful attender as long as health permitted.

The late Mr. Graham enjoyed good health until about two years before his death at which time he suffered a serious illness. His failing health forced him to take a less active part in his work, but he still retained a wholehearted interest in the affairs of his home, business and community. During these years of ill-health he was tenderly cared for by his loving wife and family. His unceasing devotedness to his wife and family leaves a vacancy which nothing can fill and that love was reciprocated in full by their constant companionship and affection. He endured his suffering with Christian fortitude and patience, trusting in Him whom he knew as Friend and Saviour. Four weeks before his passing his condition grew more critical. He was later removed to the King's County Memorial Hospital where everything possible was done to alleviate his suffering. But all that medical skill and tender care could do was to no avail, and on July 23, he laid down his burden in this world and passed on to that eternal world where he that doeth the will of God abideth forever.

Besides the immediate family there are left to mourn his passing, his mother, Mrs. Lillie Graham and one brother, Borden, at home; and four sisters: Ruth, Mrs. Maxwell MacDonald, and Alice, Mrs. Artie MacDonald, of Alliston; Florence, Mrs. Frank W. Chairman Squelches McCarthy On Point Of Order As Senate Hearing Opens

WASHINGTON (AP) — A new round of Senate hearings on the conduct of Senator Joseph McCarthy (Rep. Wis.) opened Tuesday—and recessed with chairman Arthur Watkins (Rep. Utah) gaveling the protesting McCarthy into reluctant silence.

Watkins ruled this has nothing to do with the inquiry. His two fellow Republicans, Senators Carlson and Kansas, quickly backed up the chairman.

Then McCarthy took over, and the spirited clash with Watkins followed. Television was banned, along with photography of all kinds, though camera men were admitted for a few moments to make pictures of the committee members and the other principals before the first session formally opened.

Palpable anger, Watkins pounded the committee table with his gavel and ended the session when McCarthy pressed for a clear statement whether one of the senators investigating him—Edwin C. Johnson (Dem. Colo.)—recently said every Democratic leader in Congress loathes McCarthy.

"The senator is out of order!" Watkins declared. When McCarthy tried again to be heard, the white haired Watkins, his voice trembling, told the Wisconsin lawmaker:

"We are not going to be interrupted by these diversions and headlines. We are going straight down the line. The committee will be in recess."

McCarthy shrugged, spread his hands and turned away.

SEEK CENSURE VOTE

So ended a session marked up to that point by courtroom-like decorum. The six-man select committee is investigating five groups of charges by three other senators who want the Senate to vote censure of McCarthy's activities. McCarthy and his lawyer, Edward Bennett Williams, called the committee's attention Monday to a March 12 Denver Post article quoting Johnson as saying in a telephone interview that "there is not a man among the Democratic leaders of Congress who does not loathe Joe McCarthy."

Johnson read a formal statement Tuesday asserting: "I did not say on March 12 or at any other time that I personally loathed Senator Joseph McCarthy. In response to a telephone call from Denver I agreed that some of my Democratic colleagues did not like Senator McCarthy..."

"I have full faith in my ability to weigh the charges which have been made against Senator McCarthy, together with whatever evidence that may be presented, without prejudice."

McCarthy's lawyer, told the committee he wasn't challenging Johnson's impartiality—at this point—but did want to know whether Johnson made the statements.
