The hymns were "The Lord's My Shepherd" and "Unto the Hills; two very fine solos were feelingly rendered by Mr. Stephen MacLeod. The large concourse of people entering sincerely into the singing of the hymns under the open sky, in the resting place of the dead made a dramatic impression long to be remembered.

## Using Glorious Fountains For Washing Irks Romans

ROME (Reuters) — Romans are showing signs of losing their tempers at the growing practice among foreign tourists of washing their feet in the Eternal City's most majestic fountains.

Newspapers are calling for police action.

One "very respectable looking" English couple clad in shorts and shirts were reported by a Rome newspaper to have plunged head-first into the magnificent Fontana Esedra, in the centre of one of the city's grandest piazzas.

They wallowed among the goldfish and marble sea-nymphs for a while, then emerged dripping but refreshed on a hot day, and walked away.

Another group of unidentified

tourists shocked Romans when they chose one of the two fountains in St. Peter's Square, (in front of the basilica) in which to wash their hands, faces and feet—and then gave their cars a wash-down in the same solemn setting.

Other tourists have been rolling up their trousers or lifting their skirts and soaking their feet in the "fountain of the Triton," built by Bernini in the centre of one of Rome's busiest squares.

The waters of the Fontana di Trevi (of Three Coins in the Fountain fame) have been particularly favored.

Il Momento Sera declared: "The feet-washers seem to have forgotten that they are visitors to one of the most beautiful and civilized shock and offend us."

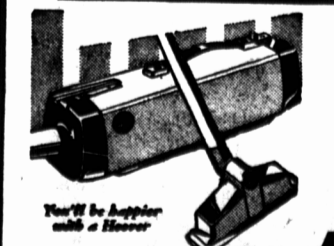
