WELCOME!

A WARM WELCOME will, we are sure, be extended by the people of Prince Edward Island to Sir Charles Tupper, Mr. Foster and Mr. Hugh John Macdonald. Though our farmers are now busy at the harvest they will not fail to crowd the meetings at which these distinguished gentlemen will speak upon the great issues of the day. Each is celebrated for his eloquence as well as for his practical statesmanship. Sir Charles Tupper has by deed, as well as word, impressed his name and personality upon all parts of Canada. Systems of education enabling the youth of every race, class and denomination to participate in the blessings of learning, great railways, crossing Province and continent, extending to all the means of easy and cheap communication and transportation and opening to unnumbered immigrants our wide and fertile prairies and our grand mountains with their unlimited wealth of forest and of mine,—these are some of the fruits of Sir Charles Tupper's labors. Fortunately Sir Charles has lived long enough to live down the slanders by which his opponents have in the past sought to lessen his influence, and to enjoy the credit and esteem due to his great abilities and his high character. Many persons are even yet opposed to him, but all men, in their hearts, honour him; and when he shall have won for the people of Canada the great boon of Preferential Trade with the Mother Country and the British Empire at large, he will have capped the climax of a grand career of struggle, development and success.

His able lieutenant, Mr. Foster, is well known to the people of this Province as one of the most laborious and talented of our younger statesmen, and one of the very best parliamentary and platform orators in this country. Among those who were with Sir John Thompson, specially selected by the best judge of men in his age and country to enter the Liberal-Conservative cabinet and become a Liberal-Conservative leader, Mr Foster has justified and is continuing to justify the hopes and expectations entertained by his friends. If his life should be spared he will have much to do in developing and building up the superstructure of the great northern British nationality of which the foundations have been so well laid.

Mr. Hugh John Macdonald, Premier of the Province of Manitoba, is personally known to but few among us. But he will be welcomed because he is the son of his father, the great Sir John, and because he has thus far in his political career, shown that his desire to be honest in his dealings with and on behalf of the people. Since he has entered upon the trust imposed by the people of Manitoba, he has repudiated corrupt and secret bargains made by his predecessors in office, the notorious Mr. Greenway and company, and has taken pains to fulfil his pre-election pledges. In this regard he has set an example for our politicians of both parties, and has compelled the admiration of the staunchest Liberals in the country. The visit of such a man as Mr Hugh John Macdonald will, upon this account, be the more interesting to the people of Prince Edward Island, who have lately seen so many instances of political corruption and deception.

Sir MacKenzie Bowell and Senator O'Brien, who are expected in Charlotte-town to-night, will also be heartily welcomed. Sir MacKenzie's good name has

preceded him. His record as a politician is of the best. Senator O'Brien is not so well known, but everyone will be glad to see him.

A WARNING.

We direct the attention of the proper authorities to the dangerous and disgraceful condition in which the roads are kept by the contractor for laying the sewer pipes. We have heard repeated complaints regarding the unsafe way that the trenches are left at night. It appears that the rights of the public are of little consideration and that nothing short of another serious accident will wake up the authorities. Last night on the Malpique Road a trench running across the road was left unprotected and it is a wonder that some person did not drive into it. To make the matter worse the light was placed at the end of the drain that was opened along the road, which was simply an invitation to go to the side and drive into the trench running at right angles. We trust that measures will at once be taken to protect the rights of the travelling public, even if by doing so the contractor will be kept in his place. If these measures are not taken a serious if not fatal accident is almost sure to happen, with the result that the city or some person will be mulcted in heavy damages.
