Fire From Tractor Destroys Home, Sheds, Near Cardigan

A fire which broke out Wednesday afternoon at 1:30 p.m. completely destroyed the home and out buildings of Mr. Cyrus Docherty at St. Peter's Road, near Cardigan.

While unloading hay, the tractor became stuck and Mr. Docherty placed hay under the wheel to create traction. In some way the hay became ignited and Mr. Docherty and a neighbour had the flames practically out, when a gust of wind caught it and blew it toward the south end of the barn, which became ignited in a matter of seconds. It soon gained entrance to the interior, and four pigs and five cattle were removed with great difficulty through a door which had been sealed. The tractor house, wood house, pump house, then ignited followed by the work shop, which was completely equipped.

Most of the furniture was saved, but all equipment, clothing, bedding were a complete loss. There was a small amount of insurance.

This is the old homestead of the Docherty family. Living at home were Mr. and Mrs. Cyrus Docherty, five children, and Mrs. John Docherty, mother of Mr. Cyrus Docherty.

Farmer Becomes Ontario Minister Of Agriculture

TORONTO (CP)—Hon. William A. Goodfellow, a farmer all his life, was sworn in Wednesday as Ontario's minister of agriculture.

Premier Frost, announcing the change in his Progressive Conservative administration, told a press conference that Mr. Goodfellow officially would retain his portfolio as minister of municipal affairs.

The premier said, however, that William Warrender, minister without portfolio, was appointed acting municipalities minister.

Mr. Goodfellow replaces former agriculture minister Fletcher Thomas, forced by ill health to relinquish the office.

300 Pheasants Are Released

On Tuesday, July 31 an additional release of three hundred, eight week old pheasants took place in Southern Kings. The release was supervised by the bird committee, consisting of Ken Clements, John White and Harvey Moore. This brings to five hundred the number released in this area. Although it is impossible to find out just where the release took place, we are advised that the territory has been well covered. Several hundred are still to be released yet this year. Fifty percent of the hatch is to go to Prince County, twenty five percent to Queens County, and the balance to be split evenly between Eastern and Southern Kings. When released the birds were in excellent condition, and there should be very few losses.
